Project Summary and Justification

Project 1 12th Street Revitalization Area

This project combines four phase/sub projects into a single project. The sub project remaining is Phase I - 11th/13th Street Core Area Design and Construction of Public Improvements. Improvements will consist of streetscape improvements along 12th Street.

Project 2 Entertainment Center

This project involves a private/public partnership project to develop a multi-screen theater and entertainment center in downtown Lincoln. City involvement will likely include site preparation and construction of public improvements on Block 41 (O-P, 11th to 12th)

Project 3 Old Federal Building Redevelopment

The project consists of the sale and private redevelopment of the City's Old Federal Building on Block 43 (O-P, 9th to 10th). City involvement will likely consist of construction of public infrastructure and other improvements needed for the building's redevelopment.

Project 4 Entryway Corridors (Phase II)

This project consists of the initial implementation of the Entryway Corridors Study for Phase II/I-180/Downtown. This CIP project notation is included in order to earmark funds for the possible implementation of improvements that may arise from that study. Funding for implementation is being (1) tied to development projects adjacent to the entryway; and (2) being pursued through foundations.

Project 5 Focus Area Revitalization Activities

The Consolidated Plan for HUD Entitlement Programs includes revitalization activities in identified Focus Areas within designated low to moderate income neighborhoods. Capital improvements may include sidewalk construction, alley construction, park development and streetscape.

Project 6 Special Assessment Assistance Program

The City undertakes 40 paving district/units per year. Of the 40 paving districts, three to four may ultimately receive CDBG assistance.

CDBG funds are used for public improvements when the assistance is restricted to paying special assessments levied against properties owned and occupied by persons of low and moderate income to recover the capital costs of the public improvement. Due to CDBG Program budget constraints, City funding assistance is limited to very low income, owner-occupied households.

Project 7 Havelock Revitalization Activities

Havelock revitalization involves streetscape and other public improvements in the Havelock Redevelopment Area

Project 8 University Place Revitalization

This project involves streetscape and other public improvements in the University Place Redevelopment Area.

Project 9 North 27th Street Redevelopment

Implementation of the identified North 27th Street Activities: acquisition, relocation, demolition and site improvements; storm and waste water repair and replacement; streetscape implementation; sidewalk, alley and street reconstruction; and construction of public facilities in the area generally located from "N" Street to the overpass at Leighton Avenue.

Project 10 Vine Street Revitalization

Implementation of the Vine Street Design Plan, from 22^{nd} Street (to tie into/coordinate with the proposed new Antelope Valley Creek and north/south roadway) to 26^{th} Street. Improvements are to include streetscape - sidewalks increased to 8 feet with new concrete walks, ornamental lighting, retaining walls and landscaping.

Project 11 Antelope Valley Revitalization

Antelope Valley revitalization involves community revitalization activities in and around the Antelope Valley Major Investment Study area. Projects will include Streetscape on "O" Street, from the proposed creek at 21st/22nd Street to tie into downtown streetscape ending at 16th Street; Streetscape along the proposed new north/south roadway; redevelopment activities along and adjacent to the proposed north/south roadway and creek including intensive efforts focused between the road and creek. Redevelopment activities may include acquisition, relocation, demolition and site improvements; repair/replacement of public utilities, sidewalk and alley reconstruction, and construction of public facilities in the area. Housing relocation may also occur which will include site preparation work, ROW acquisition and relocation.

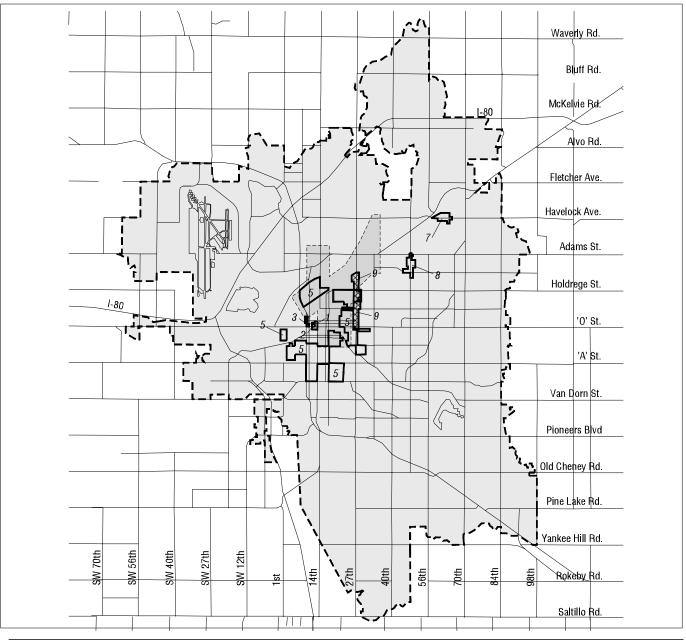
Project 12 Redevelopment Activities

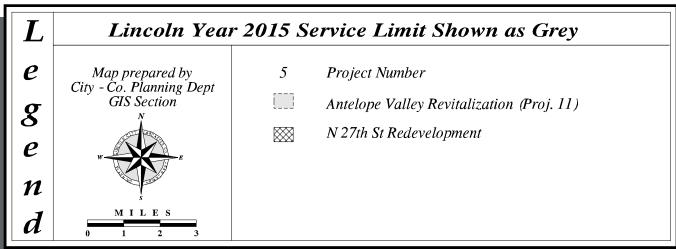
