Project Summary and Justification

Project 1 Northeast Senior Center Expansion

The Lincoln Area Agency on Aging has operated a Senior Center at 6310 Platte Avenue since July 1987. While this met the need to move the existing program, which was at Mahoney Manor, it did not allow for the diversity of programming that Lincoln Area Agency on Aging knew older adults would need and want. In 1996-97 Lincoln Area Agency on Aging and concerned community members from northeast Lincoln worked with Jim Dyke from The Architectural Partnership to determine the future facility needs of the older adults in northeast Lincoln. The schematic and cost estimates that were developed represent the results of the committee's work. This expansion of the senior center will allow for a greater variety of programming than the current center can accommodate. Examples of programming that will be held in the expanded facility are fitness classes, computer classes and counseling. The expansion will include accessible restrooms. An attached garage will allow older adults to board the senior center van inside the building thus avoiding the elements when they get on and off the van. Finally, the expansion will include a convenient, attractive and identifiable entry and facade.


Additional financing would be provided by fundraising through the Seniors Foundation, pending approval of the Seniors Foundation Board.


Project 2 New Senior Center in South Lincoln

In FY 2006-2007, the Lincoln Area Agency on Aging is proposing the initial planning for a "state of the art" senior center facility as a collaborative effort with the Parks and Recreation Department. This facility would provide services in an area of the city which is currently under served. This first phase would include organizing a panel of concerned citizens, who along with staff from the departments would work with a consultant to determine the needs in the area and develop a plan and cost estimates.
