# 0769 Pedestrian Improvements for New Schools

It also includes up grading pedestrian crossings of collector and arterial streets with appropriate striping, signing, warning devices, or other traffic control devices. Discussions will need to occur with Lincoln Public Schools and the community regarding whether busing is an option in order to delay these costs until more development and roadway improvements can be made in the area.

# 0770 New Funding for New Construction & Rehab Projects

#### **Description:**

Additional funding is needed to better meet the needs of Lincoln's streets network. This includes both new construction to meet growth demands on the street network, as well as rehabilitation of the existing street system to maintain the quality of life of our citizens. A significant new funding source will provide additional funding needed to complete identified projects in the Comprehensive Plan. The identified amount of this additional funding is not sufficient to meet all the needs of the streets program. Priority bridge replacement and repair work that may be funded with this additional revenue include but is not limited to: N. 27th & Fairfield; W. O & Sun Valley; Rosa Parks Way & Salt Creek; N. 1st South of Cornhusker; 1 mile north of Cornhusker & N. 70th. Arterial street rehabilitation work that may be funded with this additional revenue include but is not limited to: A St., Capital Pkwy to S. 56th St.; Adams, N. 36th to N. 46th; Cotner, Randolph to W. of 48th; Fletcher, N. 56th to N. 70th; Folsom, Sumner to Rosa Parks Way; Holdrege, N. 48th to N. 70th; N. 10th, Claremont to Military; N. 14th, Saunders to Yolande; N. 27th, P to I-80; N. 33rd, Holdrege to Madison; N. 48th, Superior to Fletcher; NW 12th, W. Adams to Kingbird Road; Old Cheney, S. 14th to Hwy 2; Randolph, Capital Pkwy to S. 40th; S. 27th, Hwy 2 to Calvert; S. 40th, A to Randolph; S. 70th, Old Cheney to Van Dorn; Superior, Technology Dr. to Cornhusker; Van Dorn, Hwy 77 to Folsom; W. # 0005 South Beltway

#### **Description:**

The local 20% match is expected to come from a variety of sources including RTSD, Wheel Tax, Federal Aid, and potentially an additional unknown funding source if the cost of the project increases. An agreement with the State is part of the strategy to meet the City's local match on the South Beltway by using available local Federal Aid in the amount of an additional \$11.3 million along with the 2014/2015 \$5.3 million on other State lead projects in the near term.

#### **Description:**

City funds are allocated for maintenance and repair of sidewalks Helps meet LRTP goals supporting both the maintenance / rehabilitation and Capital expenditure for Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities as existing infrastructure are improved / repaired and Capital expenditure when new amenities, such as curb ramps, are constructed. Rehabs and replaces existing infrastructure.

In previous years, sidewalk maintenance and repair has been accomplished by contract with private companies with all contracts being paid through the capital budget/CIP. In an effort to increase efficiency and responsiveness, the City Council may pilot a program in the second year of the CIP that will allow a "quick fix it team" to respond to high priority repairs, including requests for ADA compliance and accommodation (e.g. curb ramps). In order to accomplish this, a portion of what would previously have shown in the capital budget/CIP is being shifted to the operating budget in that year to pay the salaries of these employees if the pilot program moves forward. The total funding from known sources remains at approximately \$1 million in year 2. The \$2 million in unknown funding shown in years 2-6 would be supplementary to these known funds.

Additional funding is needed to more fully meet the needs of the Sidewalk Maintenance and Repair program. An unknown additional source of funding in the amount of \$2 million a year would better meet the identified needs of the sidewalk system as identified in the Comprehensive Plan.

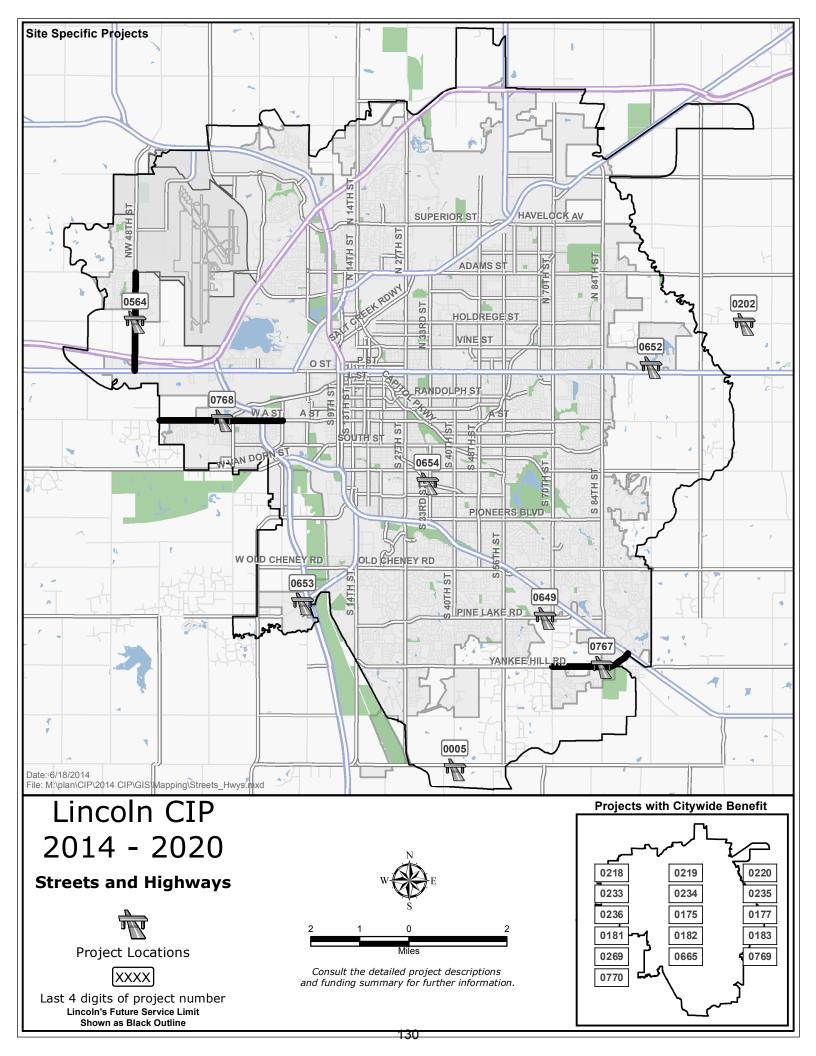
