STAFF RECOMMENDATION: For Approval

REASON FOR LEGISLATION: To provide authority for the Mayor and Finance Director to appropriate City funds for a multi-year Joint Antelope Valley (JAVA) Project. The Project is shown in the City’s 2007-2013 Capital Improvement Project as Project No. 780110, Antelope Valley “J” Street Bridge.

DISCUSSION

The current Capital Improvement Program identifies construction of the Antelope Valley “J” Street Bridge Project to occur in fiscal 2007-2008. The identified funding sources for construction of the project include City and Federal Funds.

This project consists of building a new bridge and the associated roadway on “J” Street between Capitol Parkway and 24th Streets. The new bridge replaces the existing structure which does not have sufficient hydraulic capacity to convey a 100-year flood event. Construction of the “J” Street Bridge is scheduled to begin in late May 2008 with the bridge open to traffic in the Fall of 2008. Final completion of all work including seeding and construction of the new channel liner adjacent to the bridge will be completed by June of 2009.

Federal funds will be utilized for that portion of the project construction and construction phase engineering services that are not eligible work items associated with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineer’s Antelope Creek Flood Control Project. In accordance with federal requirements, the local sponsors cannot utilize other sources of federal funds as part of their required local match for the Antelope Creek Flood Control Project.
