AN ORDINANCE amending Section 10.34.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code relating to Parking Meters: Deposit of Coins and Time Limits, to provide that no parking fee shall be charged on Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day and Veterans Day; and repealing Section 10.34.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code as hitherto existing.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section 10.34.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended to read as follows:

10.34.030 Deposit of Coins and Time Limits.

For the purpose of relieving traffic congestion and making provision for convenient parking in order to facilitate the free flow of traffic, there is hereby imposed a fee, as hereinafter provided, upon each person parking a motor vehicle upon the public streets, ways, or parking facilities, as designated by the Director of Public Works and Utilities, which, unless otherwise ordered by the Director of Public Works and Utilities and also indicated on the parking meter, after a traffic and engineering investigation, shall be imposed only between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. if any, with no fee imposed by parking Sunday, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When any vehicle has been parked in any parking space for which a parking meter has been provided, the operator of said vehicle shall, immediately after entering the said space, deposit or cause to be deposited a coin of the United States of such kind and amount as shall be indicated on the particular parking meter provided for the parking space which the operator has entered, and shall operate the mechanical device on such meter, if any, to place it in complete operation. Such parking

space may then be lawfully occupied by said vehicle during the period of parking time indicated on
said parking meter at the time allowed for the particular coin deposited.
If said vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space beyond the parking time limit
as indicated on such meter for the particular coin deposited, the parking meter shall display a sign
or signal showing that such parking is illegal, and in that event such vehicle shall be considered as
parked overtime and in violation of this title.
Section 2. That Section 10.34.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code as hitherto existing
be and the same is hereby repealed.
Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after passage
and publication in one issue of a daily or weekly newspaper of general circulation in the City,
according to law.
