# 4) PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 94-31, requested by the Interim Director of Planning, amending the 1994 Lincoln/Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to amend the land use plan and add text regarding land use, infrastructure and resources for the "S1 and S2" sub-basins, contained within an area from approximately South 14<sup>th</sup> Street on the west to South 48<sup>th</sup> Street on the east; from one-half mile south of Pine Lake Road on the north to Saltillo Road on the south, consisting of 2,876.1 acres. (199919) (1999179)

The Chair reconvened the public hearing.

Mike DeKalb, Planning Department, distributed documentation pertaining to proposed amendments to the S1 and S2 Subarea Plan (Exhibit A). Those amendments are as follows:

Add the following language to Page 19 of the S1 and S2 Subarea Plan:

A. The City and County will work to establish more specific guidelines regarding buffer width and vegetative composition, based on an examination of guidelines established by other resource agencies. Until further review is possible, information regarding buffers available from the Lower Platte South Natural Resources District, the Natural Resources Conservation Service and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will be used as a general guideline for review.

Until more specific guidelines are established, buffer width should, as a minimum, be determined according to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers formula which has been incorporated into the draft recommendations for the Stormwater Basin Planning Project: minimum buffer width equals the channel bottom width plus 60 feet plus six times the channel depth.

B. Representatives of the applicant agree that the commercial area should not be indicated next to the park and that the Subarea Plan map be amended to designate that 800 feet east of South  $27^{\rm th}$  Street, north of Yankee Hill Road and south of Porter Park remain as agriculture at the present time.

### 4) PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:

DeKalb suggested that the County Board direct the County Attorney to work with the City Attorney in developing language in relation to designating the 800 feet as agriculture.

The Chair asked if anyone wished to provide additional testimony.

Gwen Thorpe, Deputy County Attorney, issued the oath to Melva Plouzek.

Melva Plouzek, 1111 Mockingbird Lane, stated that Wilderness Park is under increasing pressure and that a thesis paper prepared by Robert Klein should be included in the record with the study conducted by the Ecological Advisory Committee.

She also stated she is concerned that they will lose Wilderness Park if people don't do more on its behalf.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the public hearing was closed.

#### MOTION:

Steinman moved and Workman seconded approval of Comprehensive Plan Amendment 94-31 to include proposed amendments (a) establishing more specific guidelines regarding buffer width and vegetative composition, based on an examination of guidelines established by other resource agencies; (b) to eliminate the commercial area on the map next to the park and amend the Subarea Plan map designating approximately 800 feet to the east of South 27th Street, north of Yankee Hill Road and south of Porter Park as agriculture at the present time and (c) direct the County Attorney to work with the City Attorney in relation to specific language regarding amendment b. On call Workman, Hudkins, Campbell, Steinman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

Susan Lonn, Chair of the Keno Prevention Fund Advisory Board, appeared and stated in 1996 the City Council and County Board allocated five percent of Keno proceeds to be targeted for prevention services. Lonn stated that the Keno Prevention Fund Board has invested 40 percent of the proceeds and that upon approval of the recommendations before the County Board they will have funded 37 agencies, for a total amount of \$325,156.

MOTION: Steinman moved and Heier seconded approval. On call Steinman, Workman, Campbell, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.
