1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, March 9, 1999. (A copy of these minutes is on

file in the Office of the Lancaster County Clerk.)

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of the minutes of March 9,

1999 with a correction that it be noted Commissioner Heier was

representing the County Board at a conference in Colorado regarding juvenile issues and facilities. On call Hudkins, Heier and Workman voted

aye. Motion carried.

2) CLAIMS: Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, March 16,

1999.

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval. On call Heier, Hudkins

and Workman voted aye. Motion carried.

3) **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A new application from Ely's Service Incorporated dba/Branched Oak Marina Incorporated in connection with a Class M (Bottle Club) and a Class E (Beer Off Sale Only) liquor license for Branched Oak Marina located at 10001 West Davey Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (1999326) (1999394) (1999351)

The Vice Chair opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to testify in favor of the application.

The Clerk administered the oath to John C Phillips, applicant.

Hudkins inquired about the hours of operation and services offered.

Phillips stated the marina would hold the Class E (Beer Off Sale Only) liquor license with hours of operation from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., seven days per week, however, the possibility exists that it may be open until midnight or 1 a.m. depending on the fishing season.

The restaurant, he explained, would hold the Class M (Bottle Club) license and would be open Thursday through Sunday in the beginning with the possibility of expanded hours at a later date. Phillips stated they are trying to lease the restaurant and have been working with Bob Jorgensen of P O Pears regarding the issue.

Phillips stated in speaking with Commissioner Workman he learned of a "Responsible Hospitality" workshop which he would be enrolling in and that he may also enroll the second manager in the workshop.

Workman stated the County Board may make the "Responsible Hospitality" workshop a condition of the license.

He stated he spoke with Roger Kern and Jim Kearney at Nebraska Game and Parks Commission who reported there were some problems at Branched Oak Lake many years ago, however, they negotiated with the federal government who allowed Game and Parks to regulate the park and water areas and there have been no problems in recent years. Workman stated the problems which occurred were not in connection with the liquor licenses in place at the time. He explained that he has requested Game and Parks to send the County Board a letter recommending that the licenses being applied for by Phillips be approved.

In response to a question asked by Workman, Phillips responded that they would not be selling single cans or bottles of beer; they will be selling six and twelve packs. He stated he didn't know if the problem of driving and drinking was so much the sale of single cans as it is the larger bottles.

The Vice Chair asked if anyone else wished to provide testimony in support of the application.

No one appeared and the Vice Chair asked if anyone wished to appear in opposition or in a neutral position.

No one appeared and the public hearing was recessed for one week.

4) OLD BUSINESS:

An application for a Class K (Wine Off Sale Only) and a Class E (Beer Off Sale Only) liquor license for Shoemaker's South Truck Stop located at 1200 Saltillo Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (1999437)

MOTION:

Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of Resolution 99-437 regarding an application for a Class E and Class K liquor license for Shoemaker's South Truck Stop and to recommend that the Liquor Control Commission consider placing the following conditions on the licensed premises: 1) Single cans and/or bottles of beer and/or malt liquor of less than thirty two ounces shall not be sold on the licensed premises and 2) Single cans and/or bottles of beer and/or wine shall not be displayed for sale in tubs of ice on the floor of the licensed area.

Heier stated he is in favor of the principle of the conditions, however, he cautioned the Board against becoming involved in setting regulations for retail business.

Diane Staab, Deputy County Attorney, clarified that the County Board is making a recommendation to the Liquor Control Commission and that they make the final decision regarding the approval or denial of the application.

ROLL CALL: Workman, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An agreement with the City of Waverly to occupy a portion of a County road right-of-way with a sidewalk/trail which will eventually match up with a crosswalk across Amberly Road. (1999403)

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded approval.

Workman stated he had a concern regarding liability and noted that the right-of-way is very close to the road. He noted there will be a guardrail in place and that the liability issue is covered in the agreement.

Heier asked where the sidewalk/trail crosses Amberly Road.

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, stated it was his understanding that it crosses East 134th Street.

ROLL CALL: Hudkins, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An agreement with Richard Keith of Great Plains Appraisal, Inc. for appraisal services, at a rate of \$90 per hour, in connection with two commercial property tax appeal cases before the Tax Equalization and Review Commission. (1999399)

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval. On call Workman, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

- C. A contract with L J Webb Contractor, Inc. for culvert construction, in the amount of \$331,692.16, at the following locations: (1999414)
 - * On North 1st Street from Fletcher Avenue to McKelvie Road
 - * On East Fletcher Avenue from North 84th Street east to North 120th Street
 - * On West Davey Road from Northwest 30th Street to Northwest 14th Street

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval. On call Heier, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

E. An application from Level 3 Communications, LLC to install fiber optic cable across County roadways within the Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railway right-of-way from West Parker Road north to West Old Cheney Road, at no cost to the County. (1999413)

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval.

Workman stated he owns shares in Level 3 Communications, however, he contacted the Accountability and Disclosure Commission regarding a conflict of interest. It was reported to him that the value of his shares in no way creates a business relationship between the company and himself.

Heier stated he also owns shares in the company and it was reported to him by the Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission that there is no conflict of interest.

ROLL CALL: Heier, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

- F. Authorization of the installation and removal of the following traffic signs on North 141st Street between Waverly Road and the Waverly city limits: (1999418)
 - * Installation of a "Reduced Speed Ahead" sign north of the reverse curves for southbound traffic
 - * Removal of a "40 mile per hour" speed advisory plate from the reverse curve sign for southbound traffic
 - * Installation of a "45 mile per hour" speed limit sign north of the reverse curves for southbound traffic
 - * Installation of a "Reduced Speed Ahead" sign north of the city limits for southbound traffic for Waverly's "25 mile per hour" speed limit sign
 - * Installation of a "45 mile per hour" speed limit sign north of the city limits for northbound traffic

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of Resolution 99-418.

In response to a question asked by Workman, Larry Worrell, County Surveyor, explained that the 45 mile per hour speed limit is north of the city limits of Waverly. Once around the curves, the speed limit increases to 55 miles per hour.

G. Re-award of bid for title searches on tax foreclosure properties for the County Attorney's office to State Title Services Inc., for \$75 per search. (1999438)

Diane Staab, Deputy County Attorney, stated their office suggested the item be re-bid because the first company was not completing title searches in a timely fashion.

She noted that David Hunter, State Title Services, indicated that the \$75 per search would be for a complete title search. Most of the searches would be Uniform Commercial Code filings and would be significantly less than \$75.

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval. On call Workman, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

H. Reappointment of Doug Boyd, Shari Clarke, Pat Galitz and Elliot Rivas to the Lincoln-Lancaster Women's Commission, terms expiring March 1, 2002. (1999409)

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded approval. On call Hudkins, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

He stated that the Clerk of the District Court issues 110,000 to 120,000 checks per year and that the machine is used on a daily basis.

Heier stated he would like more information regarding the relationship of cost versus maintenance ratio.

It was suggested that the item be deferred for one week to Tuesday, March 23, 1999.

By direction of the Vice Chair, Consent Item 6B was deferred for one week to March 23, 1999.

Heier stated Commissioner Hudkins had received the 1999 Free Enterprise Award from the Lincoln Independent Business Association and congratulated him for a job well done.

By direction of the Vice Chair, County Change of Zone 183, requested by Eugene Benes, from "AG" Agricultural to "B" Business on property located south and west of the corner of Northwest 70th Street and Agnew Road, south of the unincorporated town of Agnew in Lancaster County, Nebraska was placed on pending.
