Heier stated they are in the process of ensuring that all parties who receive monies for legal services are truly in need of such services.

Campbell noted for the record that the indigent parties are in Juvenile Court.

Steinman added the monies are also used for indigent parties in abuse/neglect cases.

F. Approval of a \$2,000 loan to Banner House Fabric and Gifts, through the Lancaster County Rural Enterprise Assistance Program (REAP). (19991269)

Campbell noted that Banner House Fabric and Gifts is located in Panama.

G. Approval of a \$1,000 loan to Patty Beecham, through the Lancaster County Rural Enterprise Assistance Program (REAP). (19991270)

MOTION: Heier moved and Steinman seconded approval.

Campbell noted for the record that the business is located in Bennet, Nebraska.

carried.

H. A political subdivision tort claim filed against the County Engineering Department by Dennis Hessheimer, in the amount of \$246.96, for damaged property. (19991273)

Campbell stated the County Board received a recommendation of denial from Sue Eckley, Workers' Compensation and Risk Management Manager, finding that there was no negligence on the part of the County.

MOTION:

Steinman moved and Heier seconded to accept the recommendation from the Workers' Compensation and Risk Management Manager and deny the tort claim filed against the County Engineering Department by Dennis Hessheimer because there was no negligence found on the part of the County. I. Renewal of a maintenance agreement with ESRI of Redlands, California for various software programs, including technical support and version upgrades, for the County Engineering Department for \$9,400, beginning July 21, 1999 and ending July 20, 2000. (19991271)

MOTION: Workman moved and Steinman seconded approval. Workman, Heier, Campbell and Steinman voted aye. Motion carried.

J. A resolution setting salaries of the Election Commissioner and Chief Deputy Election Commissioner for the four year term of office, beginning on September 7, 1999 and ending September 6, 2003. (19991266)

MOTION: Workman moved and Steinman seconded approval of Resolution 99-1266.

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, explained that the County Board is required, by statute, to set the salaries for the Election Commissioner and Chief Deputy Election Commissioner 60 days prior to the commencement of the term.

Diane Staab, Deputy County Attorney, stated that there is also a minimum amount which the Election Commissioner can be paid. She noted that the Election Commissioner in Lancaster County is also assigned Jury Commission duties which is noted in the resolution.
