- A. Continuation of a public hearing regarding an application for a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license from DLH Inc. doing business as Coaches Sports Bar & Grill, located at 640 West Prospector Court in Lancaster County, Nebraska.

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#### 4) OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

B. An agreement for the purchase of real estate from 46<sup>th</sup> Street Partners L.L.C. for a 5,000 square foot office space. The location is between Burlington Credit Union on North 46<sup>th</sup> Street and the Lancaster County Motor Vehicle Facility at 625 North 46<sup>th</sup> Street. The County will pay \$575,000 for the property subject to conditions as outlined in the agreement. (C-00-470)

#### 5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

- A. Grant contracts with the following:
  - Cedars Youth Services, in the amount of \$62,400, for services as a day reporting center, beginning September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001. (C-00-479)
  - Berniklau Educational Solutions Team, in the amount of \$100,800, for day reporting services, beginning September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001. (C-00-478)
  - Peoples City Mission, in the amount of \$30,000, for the family/women's shelter program, beginning July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001. (C-00-477)
  - Lincoln Council on Alcoholism and Drugs, in the amount of \$31,957, for the prevention of substance abuse from July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001. (C-00-476)
- B. An agreement with Family Service Association for wraparound services to no more than ten families at a time, to assist the child to remain in the community without involvement or further involvement in the juvenile justice system, beginning September 1, 2000 through August 31, 2001. The County will pay \$50,000. (C-00-471)
- C. An agreement for temporary nursing services with Interim HealthCare for the Corrections Department. The County will pay for services as provided in Appendix "A" of the agreement. Term of the contract is one year from the date of execution. (C-00-474)
- D. A contract with StarMed Health Personnel for temporary nursing services at the Corrections Department. The County will pay rates as provided in attachment "A". Term of the contract is for one year from date of execution. (C-00-475)
- E. A joint funding agreement with the United Stated Department of the Interior for water resources investigations and computation of records at the following gauging stations: Salt Creek at Roca, Little Salt Creek near Lincoln, Stevens Creek near Lincoln and Rock Creek near Ceresco. The County will pay \$7,040 for the term of the agreement from October 1, 2000 to September 30, 2001. (C-00-473)
