An agreement with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for construction of a half diamond interchange with an eastbound entrance ramp and westbound exit ramp from U.S. Highway 34 to Northwest 27<sup>th</sup> Street northwest of Lincoln, Nebraska. The State will pay the County up to \$336,956 for design, letting, award of contract and supervision of contract. (C-00-581)
- I. An Allowance Modification to Cheever Construction to change two hard wired graphic control panels at the Intake Desk and at the Control Desk of Staff Secure in the multi-use area in connection with the new Juvenile Detention Center. The Contingency/Discovery Allowance will be decreased \$2,415 by the allowance modification. (C-00-582)
