3) OLD BUSINESS:

Contracts between the County Engineer and Ray G. Wolfe, Jr. and Clifford Wolfe, in the total amount of \$14,900.81, on North 70th Street to Waverly Road; Project C55-G-405(2) (11 contracts) (C-10 through C-20)

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded approval. Steinman, Workman,

Heier, Campbell and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

4) **NEW BUSINESS:**

A. An agreement with Norris Public Power District to adjust their facility along Fletcher Avenue and Adams Street due to construction related to Project SRR-55(126). The County will pay an estimated amount of \$14,225.03. (C-00-79)

MOTION: Workman moved and Steinman seconded approval. Workman, Hudkins, Campbell, Steinman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An agreement with Radiation Detection Company to monitor radiation levels for x-rays for the dental laboratory in the Corrections Department. There are five detectors and each unit costs \$11.75 and will be charged quarterly. (C-00-80)

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval. Hudkins, Steinman, Workman, Heier and Campbell voted aye. Motion carried.

C. A contract with the Lincoln-Lancaster Mediation Center to provide professional services for neutral facilitation of meetings related to the Families First and Foremost Program. The Mediation Center will also provide training and education with regard to collaboration and conflict resolution. Contract term is September 1, 1999 through August 31, 2000 and the County will pay up to \$50,000 for the services. (C-00-61)

Dave Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, indicated that he has made the recommended changes, however, they are not reflected in the contract which the County Board is considering. He explained that the changes have been returned to the Lincoln-Lancaster Mediation Center for review and requested that the item be dropped from the agenda.

MOTION: Heier moved and Steinman seconded to accept the County Attorney's recommendation and drop the item from the agenda.

Heier noted that the contract was for a facilitator and not for mediation. He added that it will be in the form of a grant when it is approved.

D. An agreement between Lancaster County and the Supreme Court of Nebraska Administrative Office of the Courts/Probation for the use of 18 personal computers at the rate of \$24 per computer per month. (C-00-89)

E. An agreement between the County Engineer and Dwight Johnson and Associates for appraisal services, in the amount of \$10,400, in connection with Project STPE-3265(6), South 68th Street, Roca Road to Saltillo Road. (C-00-87)

In response to a question asked by Workman regarding a less expensive way to appraise the 22 parcels, Don Thomas, County Engineer, explained that there are two companies who bid their work and that he wasn't aware of any other way to perform the necessary work.

Hudkins asked if the appraisal company would be available if they have to proceed with condemnation.

Thomas stated yes.

 - < Installation of "Stop Ahead" signs on South 162nd Street north and south of the Saltillo Road intersection.

The following changes will be made August 8, 2000 at the intersection at South 162nd Street and Saltillo Road:

- < Removal of "Stop" signs on Saltillo Road for east and westbound traffic.
- < Removal of "four-way" signs below each "Stop" sign at the intersection.
- < Removal of the "Stop Ahead" sign for eastbound traffic.
- < Installation of "Cross Traffic Does Not Stop" signs below the "Stop" signs on South 162nd Street for north and southbound traffic. (These warning signs will be removed after a six month adjustment period.)

Dave Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, stated the description referring to West Denton Road and Southwest 80th Street should read "at the intersection of West Van Dorn Street and Southwest 80th Street".

MOTION: Steinman moved and Heier seconded approval of Resolution 00-20 with the description referring to West Denton Road being corrected to read West Van Dorn Street. Campbell, Heier, Steinman, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

K. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County Engineer to reject all bids received for the purchase of two motor graders. Both bids received were over the County Engineer's budgeted amount for the purchase and it is the intent to rebid the proposed purchase without the guaranteed repurchase component. (B-00-09)

In response to a question asked by Workman, Don Thomas, County Engineer, said any company has the opportunity to bid on the graders, however, many elect not to do so because of the buy back program.

Karen Miller, representing Citizens for Accountable Route Selection (CARS), appeared and presented copies of letters from 30 individuals who are concerned about the numerous negative impacts of the historical resources on the EF-1 beltway route which have not been taken into account within the preliminary assessment (Exhibit A).

Miller urged the County Board for their support in ensuring that the Federal Highway Administration prepare a new assessment of effects addressing their concerns.

In response to a question asked by Hudkins, Miller stated they had read the letters and have kept all of their responses for the preliminary assessment to directly relate to the historical issues.

Jo Gutgsell, representing the Preservation Association of Lincoln, appeared and submitted a copy of a letter written to the Federal Highway Administration in response to the preliminary assessment (Exhibit B). She stated they felt the indirect effect was not taken into account, two archeological sites were not denoted on maps and boundary issues were not considered.

Gutgsell also requested a copy of all of the comments received by the Federal Highway Administration received in relation to the preliminary assessment of adverse effects, including telephone comments.

Gutgsell also suggested that the County Board speak with the City Council regarding a muddy area at Fresh Start which needs to be paved.

Steinman stated Susan Scott, Fresh Start, will be attending a Joint Budget Committee meeting and they could speak to her about the problem at that time. It was also suggested that Gutgsell speak with Jonathon Cook, City Council member.
