3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**:

The Commissioners Award of Excellence was presented to Isa Wiens, an employee with Lancaster Manor.

4) **NEW BUSINESS**:

The Chair requested that the addendum and New Business Item A be read together.

- A. Update regarding Cheetah's and Notice of Show Cause
- Q. Receipt of reports from the Sheriff's office regarding business at Cheetah's, located at 640 West Van Dorn Street in Lancaster County, Nebraska.

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, stated that Peter Katt, registered agent for Coaches Bar and Grill, was served a cease and desist order at 4:47 p.m. on August 3rd and that later in the evening sheriff's deputies found the dancers were wearing G-strings with their breasts and buttocks fully exposed.

At 4:15 p.m. on Friday, August 4th, the attire of the dancers remained the same, however, when sheriff's deputies returned at 9:50 p.m. the dancers wore a single Band-aid over their nipples.

Wagner said at 4:15 p.m. on Saturday, August 5th, it was reported that dancers had two Band-aids crisscrossed over their nipples and wore bikini bottoms.

In response to a question asked by Steinman, Wagner said the report indicated that the dancers' breasts were fully exposed with the exception of the nipple area.

Steinman also asked if the deputies informed the proprietor about the dancers covering their breasts.

Wagner said Captain George Lahners provided the proprietor with a copy of Resolution 3557 on the day Cheetah's opened (July 28, 2000).

Peter Katt, legal counsel for DLH, Inc., stated that after he received the cease and desist order he met with his client regarding the legal issues involved and provided written notice, within 24 hours, to the contract provider. He added that he also provided written notice to the County Board regarding their plans to bring the property into compliance.

Katt explained they requested that the contract provider provide a written compliance plan in relation to Resolution 3557. He explained that a letter was received, from the attorney representing the contract provider, indicating bikini tops and bottoms would be worn by the dancers, beginning August 9th. This would bring them into compliance with the resolution.

Dave Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, submitted a copy of a letter, dated August 8, 2000, from Craig Wittstruck, attorney for contract provider, into the record (Exhibit A).

MOTION: Steinman moved and Heier seconded to request the County Attorney's office issue and serve a notice for a hearing with regard to the revocation and suspension of the liquor license of DLH, Inc. doing business as Coaches Sports Bar and Grill at 640 West Prospector Court, pursuant to County Board Resolution 3557.

It was the consensus of the County Board to set the hearing for Thursday, August 24, 2000 at 1 p.m.

B. Application for a Special Designated License from Wine Merchants Inc. to hold a summer employee party for Talent Plus at Boss Hog's Party Barn, located at 6305 West Adams Street. The party will be held on Friday, August 18, 2000 from 5 p.m. to 12 a.m.

MOTION: Steinman moved and Heier seconded approval. Hudkins, Steinman, Workman, Heier and Campbell voted aye. Motion carried.

C. An agreement with Central Plains Distributing, Inc., formerly known as Carrier Corporation, for sublease of certain space located at 1155 Saunders Avenue, in the amount of \$21,240 per annum, beginning June 1, 2000 and ending August 31, 2001. (C-00-392)

Dave Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, noted a discrepancy in the original lease size and the sub-lease size.

He also made the Board aware of the possibility that the County may have to pay the taxes in addition to the \$21,240 per annum.

Johnson requested that the item be dropped from the agenda to allow further review.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded to drop the agreement with Central Plains Distributing, Inc. from the agenda. Steinman, Workman, Campbell, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

D. Two agreements with Educational Management to provide students for the federal work study program. The students will earn \$7 per hour and the County is responsible for 25 percent of the compensation. One contract is for students at the Corrections Department and the other is for the County Clerk's Office. (C-00-395 and C-00-396)

MOTION: Steinman moved and Heier seconded approval. Heier, Workman, Hudkins, Campbell and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

E. Utility Permit Number 531, requested by Pine Lake Development L.L.C., to construct a booster pump station at South 84th Street and Pine Lake Road. The permit allows grading and access and does not involve actual water line construction. (C-00-380)

Dave Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, requested the permit be deferred for one week.

By direction of the Chair, Utility Permit Number 531 was deferred for one week at the request of the County Attorney's office.

F. Utility Permit Number 533, requested by Peoples Natural Gas, to locate a 12 inch main on the south side of Havelock Avenue from the Lincoln city limits east to a location 800 feet east of North 84th Street. (C-00-381)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval. Heier, Workman, Steinman, Campbell and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

G. An addendum to an agreement with the law firm of Anderson, Creager and Wittstruck for the representation of indigent parties, to include law violation cases, in the amount of \$750 per month, beginning July 1, 2000 and ending December 31, 2000. (C-00-379)

H. An amendment to a temporary license agreement to change the name of the licensee from World Wide Fiber to 360networks (U.S.A) Inc., and to extend the term of the license until January 11, 2001 or 60 days after the adoption of the County's Telecommunications Enabling Resolution. (C-00-384)

I. An amendment to a contract reflecting a change in the name of contracting party from Glynn, Bollerup & Huxoll, P.C. to Bollerup & Huxoll P.C. The original agreement provides legal representation to indigent families in Juvenile Court. (C-00-382)

J. An addendum to an agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration to provide monitoring services in juvenile cases. The addendum defines the supervision services that will be provided. (C-00-383)
