- I. Supplemental agreement number one to an agreement entered into with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads which was executed in July, 2000 for Bridge Project BR-3300(2). The supplemental agreement is necessary due to a change in the percentage of shares payable by the parties. The County's participation will change from 20 percent to 15 percent. The project is located approximately .85 mile east of the southwest corner of Section 36, Township 9 North, Range 6 East and extends .2 mile east crossing Salt Creek. (C-02-0341)
- J. An interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln and Lancaster County to provide for compliance checks with regard to businesses selling tobacco products.
