- D. Proposed use of Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Funds, in the amount of \$106,960, by the Lancaster County Sheriff. The funds will be used for adult drug court portable radios.
- E. Issuance of Industrial Development Revenue Bonds (Plastic Companies Enterprises, Inc. Project), not to exceed \$1,300,000, pursuant to Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1997, Sections 13-1101 et seq., as amended, the proceeds of which will be used to defray all or a portion of the cost of acquiring and installing certain equipment for the molding of plastics and related necessary and appropriate equipment and facilities located in Lancaster County, Nebraska and to be operated by Plastic Companies Enterprises, Inc. a Texas corporation, and its wholly owned subsidiaries, Geist Manufacturing, Corp. and Heinke Technology, Inc., and to discuss matters relating to the final authorization, sale and issuance of such bonds. The bonds will be a limited obligation of Lancaster County and the interest thereon will be payable solely from the revenues derived from a lease agreement.

6) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. A resolution in the matter of granting public approval within the meaning of Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and authorizing the sale and issuance in one or more series pursuant to a plan of financing of not to exceed \$1,300,000 of Industrial Development Revenue Bonds (Plastic Companies Enterprises, Inc. Project), in accordance with Section 13-1101 to 13-1110, inclusive, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1997, as amended, for the purpose of financing an Industrial Development Project consisting of the acquisition and installation of certain equipment for the molding of plastics and related necessary and appropriate equipment and facilities located in Lancaster County, Nebraska, which bonds and the interest thereon shall be payable solely from the amounts to be paid by Plastic Companies Enterprises, Inc. under a lease agreement among the County, the Company and the Purchaser of such bonds which amounts are pledged to the payment of the bonds; approving and authorizing the execution of an escrow agreement among the County, the Company, the Purchaser and West Gate

6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

Bank, as escrow agent; approve and authorizing execution of the lease agreement among the County, the Company, and the Purchaser of the bonds with respect to the project containing certain options and covenants to purchase said project; approving and authorizing execution of a tax regulatory agreement and arbitrage certificate among the County, the Company and the Purchaser; and determining that said bonds shall not constitute or give rise to any pecuniary liability of Lancaster County, in the State of Nebraska or charge against its general credit or taxing powers. - B. An agreement with the University of Nebraska Medical Center College of Nursing to permit UNMC students to participate in patient care at the Community Mental Health Center. The term of the agreement is one year effective July 1, 2002 with automatically renewable terms. The agreement has a 60 day termination clause. (C-02-0501)
- C. Interlocal agreements with Gage and Washington counties for the safekeeping, care and sustenance of juveniles while at the Lancaster County Juvenile Detention Center. Gage and Washington counties will pay the County at a rate of \$200 per day for youth placed at the Juvenile Detention Center. The agreements are effective upon execution by both parties and have a 30 day termination provision. (C-02-0502 and C-02-0503)
- D. An agreement with Warren F. Cook and Associates for consulting services for the coordination of adult offender services, beginning October 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2003. The County will pay up to \$30,000 upon receipt of proper documentation and reports from the contractor. (C-02-0500)
- E. An agreement with the University of Nebraska, Department of Psychology, Psychological Consultation Center for the provision of psychological evaluation services for individuals enrolled in the Lancaster County Adult Drug Court. The County will pay \$1,000 per month for supervision and administrative costs related to the services. The County will also pay up to \$150 per participant should the individual enrolled in the Lancaster County Adult Drug court not pay the University within 30 days of receipt of an invoice for psychological services provided. The term of the agreement is October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003. (C-02-0505)

6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- F. A grant contract with Berniklau Educational Solutions Team (B.E.S.T.) to provide management of the project and grant funds for a day reporting center for six juveniles at a rate of \$50 per day for 260 days a year. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. The County shall make a grant in the amount of \$78,000. (C-02-0506)
- G. A grant contract with the Rape/Spouse Abuse Crisis Center for the oversight and management of two full-time advocates who supply enhanced 24 hour advocacy to victims. The County shall make a grant in the amount of \$56,858 for the services. The term of the agreement is from June 1, 2002 to May 31, 2003. (C-02-0507)
- H. A grant contract with Cedars Youth Service, Inc. to provide funding for "Teaching and Learning with Children", Housing and Children's Shelter and the Freeway Station. The County will provide a grant in the amount of \$275,000 to support these programs. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. (C-02-0508)
- I. An agreement with Nebraska Machinery for the purchase of two Caterpillar Model 140H motor graders. The cost of the motor graders is \$356,800 minus \$50,000 for trade-in of county machines 337 and 330. The total cost to be paid to Nebraska Machinery is \$306,800. (C-02-0509)
- J. An agreement with Alliance Holding LLC regarding Lancaster County Tax Sale Certificate 34813 and Lancaster County Treasurer's Tax Deed dated August 23, 2002. (C-02-0513)
- K. An amendment to a grant contract with Cedars Youth Services. The grant contract was under Contract Number C-02-129 and was for the purpose of providing management support to the Clyde Malone Center. The original grant contract was in the amount of \$6,000. The amendment provides an additional \$4,000 in funds for a total grant in the amount of \$10,000. (C-02-0504)
- L. Addendum number two to a food services agreement with Aramark Correctional Services, Inc. clarifying that Cornhusker Place has been made a party to the agreement between Lancaster County and Aramark and will be billed directly in accordance with the price structure as outlined in the original agreement, which is under County contract number C-02-0454. Aramark recognizes that the County is not responsible for any losses, claims or payment to Aramark as a result of services provided to Cornhusker Place. (C-02-0514)
