A. Exchange of properties and execution of deeds for County properties legally described as Lot 111, Irregular Tract located in the southwest quarter of Section 35, Township 10 North, Range 6 East of the 6<sup>th</sup> Prime Meridian, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska and 1309 "M" Street, Original Plat, Block 90, Lots 4 through 6 in exchange of properties owned by B & J Partnership, LTD., located at 902 "K" Street and 400 South 9<sup>th</sup> Street. # 7) NEW BUSINESS:

- A. A grant contract with Capital Sports Foundation for an eight week summer sports program for up to 12 youth identified as high risk in the fifth and sixth grades. The term of the agreement is from June 3, 2002 to August 31, 2002. The County shall pay \$8,500 for the services. (C-02-0548)
- B. An agreement for legislative and lobbying services with Kissel/E & S Associates for services related to representing Lancaster County before the Nebraska Unicameral. The term of the agreement is for two years from November 1, 2002 to October 31, 2004. The County shall pay \$46,000 per year. (C-02-0549)
- C. An agreement with Sericycle, Inc. for the removal and disposal of biomedical waste at the Juvenile Detention Center. The term of the agreement is two years from the date of execution and the County will pay \$30 per month for services four times a year. (C-02-0550)
- D. A contract with Segal Advisors for consulting services relating to the current Lancaster County Employee Pension Plan, in the amount of \$10,000 for Phase I which includes all expenses. (C-02-0551)
- E. A program agreement with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for Project Number BR-3280(3), Sprague East, Lancaster County Bridge Number T-109. The agreement requires the County to earmark \$88,200 which is 20 percent of the estimated cost of the project. The Federal share shall be 80 percent of the estimated costs. The State has the responsibility of the construction of the project. (C-02-0552)

- F. A program agreement with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for Project Number STPAA-BR-5201(1), Raymond South (Northwest 48<sup>th</sup> Street), Lancaster County Bridge Number F-44. The agreement requires the County to earmark \$218,920 which is 20 percent of the estimated cost of the project. The State is responsible for the project and the Federal government is responsible for 80 percent of the estimated cost of the project. (C-02-0553)
- G. Approval of application, assurances and certifications for the Fiscal Year 2002 State Domestic Preparedness Grant Program for the State of Nebraska. The grant was passed from the Federal level to the State level and applications must be submitted to the State which is charged with administration of the grant funds. Funds received shall assist in the implementation of strategies developed locally to address domestic preparedness while maintaining compatibility with statewide strategies for domestic preparedness.
- H. A political subdivision tort claim filed against the Lancaster County Corrections Department by Cullen Birdine for lost property, in the amount of \$2.
