An agreement with ServiceLinc for the provision of employment services to persons referred to them by the Lancaster County Community Mental Health Center with serious mental disorders in an effort to impact symptoms and functioning of those individuals. The term of the agreement is September 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. The County shall pay up to \$25,060 for the services. (C-02-0555)
- C. An agreement with the Nebraska Department of Education, Vocational Rehabilitation for employment services in the area of career planning, job placement services and job exploration. The term of the agreement is September 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. Vocational Rehabilitation shall contribute \$14,000 to the County for the provision of these services. The County is responsible for another \$14,000 in matching funds. (C-02-554)
- D. A contract with Alternative Business Systems to provide cost-per-copy photocopy services for a City-County centrally managed program. The City-County Purchasing Department will pay \$0.0184 per copy for all copies produced on the program by one consolidated central bill. The Purchasing Department will then bill back each user at a rate of \$0.02 to cover the cost of administering the program. All users will provide their own paper on the new contract. Term of the agreement is January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2006, with an option to renew for three additional one year periods. - E. An agreement with Theisen Construction, Inc. of Norfolk, Nebraska, for repair of County Structure B-230 (Project 03-16).
