6) NEW BUSINESS:

- A. A grant contract with Cedars Youth Services for management of the projects and grant funds, for Tracker Program support and for a Day Reporting Center. The County shall pay \$169,800 for the services. The term of the grant contract is July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. (C-02-0559)
- B. Supplemental Agreement 2 with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for staking and inspection on Project BR-3300(2), Roca Northwest, Lancaster County Structure Number 0-66. The County entered into the original agreement on June 27, 2000 and Supplemental Agreement 1 on July 30, 2002. Supplemental Agreement 2 requires the County to provide for supervision and inspection of the construction, due to the lack of available State personnel. The County will be reimbursed based upon actual costs in accordance with Federal guidelines. The State will pay 85 percent of the actual eligible costs. (C-02-0560)
- C. A Harvest Project contract with CenterPointe for professional services and staff for the delivery of services to older persons who are at risk due to complex mental health, substance abuse and aging related needs. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. The County will pay CenterPointe \$40,672 for the services provided in the agreement. (C-02-0562)
- D. An agreement with the law firm of Orton, Thomas and O'Connell for legal representation to indigent parties in proceedings arising pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-247 (1), (2), (3)(a), (4), (5), (6) and (8) in the separate Juvenile Court of Lancaster County. The term of the agreement is from January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2005.
