Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 02001.B, requested by the Realty Trust Group, to amend the 2025 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to change the designation from Agriculture to Urban Residential and Commercial uses, on property generally located at the southeast corner of 84<sup>th</sup> and South Streets.
- D. Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 02002.2, requested by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, to amend the 2025 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to modify the land use designation for the Downtown Campus and the East Campus area to reflect current boundaries and future expansion of the University.

Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 02002.8, requested by Arvid and Wava Wunderlich and Cornhusker Energy Lexington, L.L.C., to amend the 2025 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to change 140 acres from Agriculture and Agriculture Stream Corridor to Industrial, on property generally located at North 162<sup>nd</sup> Street and Highway 6.
- G. Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 02002.9, requested by the Lancaster County Agricultural Society, to amend the 2025 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to change 10 to 12 acres of Public/Semi-Public and Greenspace to Commercial, on property generally located at the southeast corner of North 84<sup>th</sup> Street and Havelock Avenue.
- H. Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 02002.11, requested by Brian D. Carstens and Associates on behalf of Krein Real Estate, to amend the 2025 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to change property from Public and Semi-Public to Commercial, generally located approximately one block southeast of South 70<sup>th</sup> Street and "O" Street.

Comprehensive Plan Amendment Number 02003, requested by the Director of Planning at the request of the Director of Parks and Recreation, to amend the "Future Conditions: Parks, Recreation and Open Space" section of the 2025 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to correct the text regarding the description of neighborhood parks relating to the number of acres comprising a typical neighborhood park site.

# 5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

- A. A contract with the Board of Regents, University of Nebraska, University of Nebraska Public Policy Center for the implementation of a human services needs assessment and comprehensive plan. The County shall pay up to \$105,000. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. (C-02-0565)
- B. A Region V Network Provider Contract for services under the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH). The County, through the services of the Community Mental Health Center, would provide outreach services, community mental health services and screening and diagnostic services. The term of the agreement is October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003. The County shall be paid up to \$32,500 for the services. The County will provide up to \$10,833. (C-02-0566)
- C. Utility Permit 630 for the City of Lincoln Water System to install a 48 inch water line between Pine Lake Road and Yankee Hill Road in the right-of-way of South 84<sup>th</sup> Street. (C-02-0567)

- D. An amendment to an interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration. The original agreement was executed on October 22, 2002 under County Contract C-02-0533, for the administration of the Drug Treatment Court within Lancaster County. The amendment replaces the secretary position at a cost of \$18,922 with the position of case manager, at a cost of \$21,002. All other terms and conditions shall remain in full force and effect. - E. An amendment to a utility relocation agreement with Norris Public Power District. The original agreement was for the purpose of adjustment and relocation of the utility's facility along the County project on Denton Road from Southwest 140<sup>th</sup> Street to Denton, Nebraska. The County Engineering Department has been advised that additional costs are necessary for the relocation. The County's share is an addition \$2,306.78. (C-02-0570)
