The Board of Commissioners meeting was convened at 1:35 p.m.

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, February 12, 2002. (A copy of these minutes is on file in the office of the Lancaster County Clerk.)

MOTION: Heier moved and Stevens seconded approval of the minutes of the

Board of Commissioners meeting dated February 12, 2002. Hudkins, Heier, Workman and Stevens voted ave. Campbell abstained from

voting. Motion carried.

2) **CLAIMS FOR REVIEW**:

There were no claims for review.

3) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, February 19, 2002.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the claims

processed through February 19, 2002. Stevens, Workman, Heier,

Campbell and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

4) **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A. A petition from ten percent of the property owners within the Deerhaven Acres Subdivision for formation of a Special Paving Improvement District for the paving of Deerhaven Drive, South 63rd Street, Doe Drive, Doe Circle, Trophy Road and South 60th Street, all located within the Deerhaven Acres Subdivision in Lancaster County, Nebraska.

The Chair opened the public hearing.

Doug Cyr, Deputy County Attorney, explained that the County Board's role in the process was to receive testimony regarding the boundaries of the district and support and/or opposition from the property owners within the proposed district. He further stated that the County Board would need to make a motion to approve or deny the creation of the paving district and a written order would need to be entered within one week of the public hearing date creating the paving district.

The Chair asked if anyone wished to testify in favor of the petition.

Jim Peschong, 10901 South 60th Street, appeared in favor of creating the special paving improvement district for Deerhaven Acres. He stated there are 20 acreages located within the development and approximately 75 percent of the property owners are in favor of the paving district. Peschong stated Deerhaven Drive, South 63rd Street, Doe Drive, Doe Circle, Trophy Road and South 60th Street are located within the subdivision.

Campbell asked Don Thomas, County Engineer, if he had reviewed the petition.

Thomas stated the petition was reviewed and meets all criteria.

The Chair asked if anyone wished to testify in opposition or in a neutral position.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

MOTION:

Campbell moved and Stevens seconded to direct the County Attorney's Office to develop the appropriate motions for a vote on the subdivision request and the boundaries as presented during the public hearing. Workman, Hudkins, Campbell, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An agreement between Lancaster County and the Child Advocacy Center to conduct interviews and medical examinations of child abuse victims to aid law enforcement and prosecution in their investigations of child abuse. The term of the agreement began October 1, 2001 and ends September 30, 2002. The County will pay \$15,000 for these services. (C-02-57)

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, explained that \$10,000 would come from the County Attorney's budget and \$5,000 would come from the Sheriff's budget.

Cyr stated he had noted that the contract had called for the payment of \$15,000, however, the contract was silent as to a payment schedule. He stated there should be clarification as to the payment schedule.

MOTION: Campbell moved and Heier seconded approval of an agreement with

Child Advocacy Center subject to clarification of the payment schedule by the County Attorney's Office. Hudkins, Stevens, Workman, Heier and Campbell voted aye. Motion carried.

B. A utility agreement with Norris Public Power District of Beatrice for the adjustment of utilities as they affect construction on Firth Road at the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad designated as Project C55-X-402(5), Firth Viaduct. The County will pay up to \$31,000 for moving the utilities. (C-02-58)

MOTION: Campbell moved and Hudkins seconded approval of a utility agreement with Norris Public Power District of Beatrice. Stevens, Workman, Campbell, Hudkins and Heier voted ave. Motion carried.

C. An interlocal agreement with Lincoln Electric System (LES) for acquisition of property interests of various property owners in conjunction with an LES line transmission project and a County road project generally located from 19th Street and Alvo Road to Northwest 12th Street and Arbor Road. The County will pay for the right-of-way expenses for interests in properties the County needs for its project. (C-02-59)

Charles Humble, attorney representing Lincoln Electric System, appeared and gave a brief overview of the project.

MOTION: Campbell moved and Stevens seconded approval of an interlocal agreement with Lincoln Electric System. Heier, Workman, Hudkins,

Campbell and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

D. An agreement with Election Systems and Software, Inc. for a voter tabulation system and services agreement for the Lancaster County Election Commission Office. The County will pay \$29,475 for the equipment, license fees and support services. (C-02-60)

Dave Shively, Election Commissioner, explained that the contract is in relation to their absentee voting machines and absentee software.

MOTION: Campbell moved and Stevens seconded approval of an agreement with Election Systems and Software, Inc. Campbell, Stevens, Workman, Heier and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

E. An agreement with the City of Lincoln to have the County, through the services of the Lancaster County Cooperative Extension Office, supply educational kits entitled: "Garbology: A Waste Watchers Guide" to 2,500 second graders in 42 Lincoln/Lancaster County schools in the 2001-2002 school year. The County will receive \$10,650 for the services. (C-02-61)

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Campbell seconded approval of an agreement with the City of Lincoln. Heier, Workman, Stevens, Campbell and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

F. An agreement with Clyde Malone Community Center for care coordination and wraparound services as they relate to the Families First and Foremost project to assist juveniles with severe emotional distress, who are in danger of contact with the juvenile justice system. The term of the agreement began September 1, 2001 and ended December 1, 2001. The cost to the County is \$12,083.85. (C-02-62)

MOTION: Campbell moved and Heier seconded approval of an agreement with Clyde Malone Community Center.

In response to a question asked by Stevens, Cyr stated it concerned him that the County would enter into a contract when the term of the contract had expired. He stated that it also concerns him that an itemized statement setting forth labor that was provided was not included when it is a requirement of the contract.

Campbell stated she thought the County Attorney's Office had recommended that there be a contract of record even though the payment had been authorized.
