The Board of Commissioners meeting was convened at 1:30 p.m.

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, August 20, 2002. (A copy of these minutes is on file in the office of the Lancaster County Clerk.)

MOTION: Campbell moved and Heier seconded approval of the minutes of the

Board of Commissioners meeting dated August 20, 2002. Campbell, Hudkins, Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

2) SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

- A. The County-City Volunteer of the Month Award was presented to Norma Cochran for her services with the Lincoln library system.
- B. The Commissioners Award of Excellence was presented to Lori M. Swanson, Juvenile Detention Officer.

2) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS CONTINUED:**

C. Approval of recommendations from the Keno Advisory Board, in the total amount of \$39,950, for 12 agencies.

Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator, appeared and introduced Michael Carpenter, Chair of the Keno Advisory Board.

Carpenter summarized the history of the Keno Advisory Board, stating they have issued over \$628,000 in funds and have over \$370,000 invested in their reserve account. He stated the goal, per the direction of the County Board, is to maintain 60 percent expenditure and 40 percent reserve. Carpenter stated another goal of the advisory board was to address gambling and prevention issues. To date six grants have been given to organizations on behalf of gambling/prevention totaling over \$35,000.

MOTION: Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the

recommendations from the Keno Advisory Board, in the total amount of \$39,950, for 12 agencies. Workman, Hudkins, Campbell, Stevens

and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

3) **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

David Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, appeared and requested that the item be held.

645-5412, dated August 1, 2002, payable to David Smith, an employee of the Cooperative Extension Office, in the amount of \$227.78, for work clothing. Stevens, Workman, Campbell, Hudkins

and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Campbell seconded approval of all claims

processed through August 27, 2002. Heier, Workman, Hudkins,

Campbell and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

6) **PUBLIC HEARINGS:** (Those people wishing to testify will be sworn in.)

A. Continuation of a public hearing regarding an application for Corporate Manager for Lorin Dagel in connection with a Class K (Wine Off Sale Only) and a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license held by Firethorn Investments d/b/a Firethorn Golf Club, located at 9301 Firethorn Lane, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska.

The Chair reconvened the public hearing.

The Clerk administered the oath to Lorin Dagel, applicant.

Campbell inquired about the discrepancy relating to question one on the application.

Dagel stated it was his assumption the charges were dropped because he was a minor when they occurred.

Stevens asked about Dagel's length of employment at Firethorn.

Dagel responded he was the head chef for four and one-half years.

In response to a question asked by Workman, Dagel stated he has not attended any responsible hospitality classes regarding alcohol.

Stevens asked if the Board could make the application contingent upon completion of a responsible hospitality class and clarification of the question relative to ever having been convicted or pleading guilty to any criminal charge.

Dagel indicated he would have no objections to either suggestion.

Johnson stated he could draft the resolution to include completion of a responsible hospitality class by the applicant and written clarification, submitted by the applicant, relating to question one on the application.

6) PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:

Discussion continued relating to question one on the application with Dagel explaining that he had worked with Juvenile Diversion regarding the violation. He stated they (Juvenile Diversion) had informed him the charges would be dropped.

Terry Wagner, Sheriff, stated both of the charges were City ordinance violations. He explained that upon successful completion of the diversion program within the County, the charges are dismissed from the individual's record and they do not show up as a conviction, however, diversion programs within the City may not work the same way.

Campbell suggested that a copy of the minutes be attached to the resolution when it is sent to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.

In response to a question asked by Heier, Dagel responded that he had never appeared before a judge.

Heier suggested that Dagel speak with the City Attorney and the Sheriff regarding his record.

The Chair asked if anyone wished to testify in favor or in opposition to the application.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

MOTION:

Campbell moved and Heier seconded that the County Board recommend approval of the Corporate Manager application for Lorin Dagel in connection with a Class K (Wine Off Sale Only) and a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license held by Firethorn Investments d/b/a Firethorn Golf Club, located at 9301 Firethorn Lane with the condition that the applicant complete a responsible hospitality course and to also request the County Clerk's Office to send a copy of the minutes to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission with the resolution clarifying the Sheriff's letter with the testimony of the applicant. Campbell, Stevens, Workman, Heier and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

6) **PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:**

B. Continuation of a public hearing regarding an application for Corporate Manager for Roy G. Dickson in connection with a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license held by Corporate Golf Marketing d/b/a Yankee Hill Country Club, located at 7600 San Mateo Lane, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska.

The Chair reconvened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to testify in support, in opposition or in a neutral position to the application.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

MOTION: Campbell moved and Stevens seconded approval of the application

for Corporate Manager for Roy G. Dickson in connection with a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license held by Corporate Golf Marketing d/b/a

Yankee Hill Country Club, located at 7600 San Mateo Lane.

FRIENDLY AMENDMENT: Heier offered a friendly amendment that the applicant attend a responsible hospitality class.

Both the maker of the motion and the seconder accepted the friendly amendment.

ROLL CALL: Heier, Workman, Stevens, Campbell and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

C. An application for a Class B (Beer Off Sale Only) and a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license from Dustin and Nancy Duba d/b/a Dusty's Bar & Grill (formerly known as The Kramer Bar) located at 109 1st Street in Kramer, Lancaster County, Nebraska.

The Chair opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to testify in favor, opposition or in a neutral position to the application.

The Clerk administered the oath to Dustin Duba, applicant.

In response to questions asked by Campbell, Duba stated he had never attended a responsible hospitality class. He added that he has worked for Todd Hoyer, former owner of The Kramer Bar, for the past two years on a part-time basis.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

6) **PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:**

No one appeared and the Chair recessed the public hearing for one week for additional testimony.

7) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An application for a Special Events Permit from Team Kaos Cycling Club to hold the Branched Oak Road Race on Sunday, September 8, 2002, beginning at 8 a.m. The race will begin at the marina and proceed clockwise around the lake using West Rock Creek Road, West Raymond Road and Northwest 140th Street.

John Peterson, applicant, appeared and submitted a map into the record outlining the route of the bicycle race (Exhibit 1). He explained that they have promoted the road race since 1992 and that there will be riders from all over the region competing.

Also appearing was John Lefler, Jr.

In response to questions asked by Stevens regarding the recommendations from the County Engineering Department and the Sheriff's Office, Peterson stated they would be complying with those conditions.

MOTION:

Campbell moved and Stevens seconded approval of the application for a Special Events Permit from Team Kaos Cycling Club to hold the Branched Oak Road Race on Sunday, September 8, 2002, beginning at 8 a.m. The race will begin at the marina and proceed clockwise around the lake using West Rock Creek Road, West Raymond Road and Northwest 140th Street subject to the conditions as outlined by the Sheriff's Office and the County Engineering Department. Workman, Campbell, Hudkins, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An interlocal agreement with the Village of Bennet for law enforcement services beginning September 1, 2002 and ending August 31, 2003. The County will provide the services of one sheriff's deputy to Bennet. The Village shall pay the County a rate equal to overtime compensation which the County would pay the deputy who worked the duty. (C-02-0399)

Terry Wagner, Sheriff, appeared and stated that the interlocal agreement also includes a mileage fee for the vehicle.

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Campbell seconded approval of an interlocal agreement with the Village of Bennet for law enforcement services beginning September 1, 2002 and ending August 31, 2003. The County will provide the services of one sheriff's deputy to Bennet. The Village shall pay the County a rate equal to overtime compensation which the County would pay the deputy who worked the duty. Hudkins, Workman, Heier, Campbell and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

C. A contract with Justice Benefits, Inc. for grant writing services and professional assistance to the Lancaster County Corrections Department in making application and claim for eligible funding under the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP). The term of the agreement is a two year term from the date of execution for the following reporting periods: July 1, 2001 to June 30, 2002 with application in January, 2003 and for July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003 with application in January, 2004. The County shall pay Justice Benefits, Inc. 22 percent of all revenue paid to the County for SCAAP as compensation. (C-02-0400)

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Campbell seconded approval of an agreement with Speece-Lewis, Inc. for hydraulic analysis, bridge design and plan preparation on Project STPAA-BR-5021(1), Raymond South, County Structure F-44 on Northwest 48th Street at its intersection with Elk Creek. The County shall pay \$17,400 for the services. The services shall be completed 90 days after the contractor is provided with a notice to proceed from the County. Campbell, Hudkins, Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

The change order provides for the installation of a 30 inch round equivalent culvert pipe at Station 124 + 51 in lieu of the 30 inch round culvert pipe provided in the original plans. The change allows adequate fill over the culvert pipe. The additional cost to the County will be \$1,846.30. (C-02-0410)

The change order provides for the installation of a 30 inch round equivalent culvert pipe at Station 124 + 51 in lieu of the 30 inch round culvert pipe provided in the original plans. The change allows adequate fill over the culvert pipe. The additional cost to the County will be \$1,846.30. Heier, Campbell, Stevens, Hudkins and Workman voted aye. Motion carried.

G. An agreement with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads to supply funding to the County's public transportation assistance program to provide state financial assistance to qualified eligible recipients. The State will provide assistance under the Federal Transit Act and the Nebraska Public Transportation Act for the operation of the project. The Federal share shall not exceed \$17,093 and the State share shall not exceed \$20,691. The County share shall be all remaining eligible operating costs not paid by those funds which is estimated to total \$20,691. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. (C-02-0411)
