3 WRAPAROUND MILWAUKEE FUNDING MODEL - Bruce Kamradt, Wraparound Milwaukee Project Director

Bruce Kamradt, Wraparound Milwaukee Project Director, gave an overview of Wraparound Milwaukee Program (Exhibit A):

Board members posed the following questions:

* How often is the program evaluated?

Kamradt said there is continual evaluation.

* Had the State of Wisconsin done other "carve outs" of Medicaid?

Kamradt said Wisconsin has long experimented with specialized managed care programs.

* Has the State of Wisconsin ever requested funds back during tight budget times?

Kamradt said no, the State of Wisconsin recognizes that the system would have cost more in the end without Wraparound Milwaukee. The State has asked Wraparound Milwaukee to take on different populations, such as children in the foster care system.

* How many families in the program were in risk of termination of parental rights?

Kamradt said a substantial number were at risk and said 25-30% of the kids in the program were impacted by parental abandonment, neglect or abuse.

* What are the contributing factors to severe mental illness in youth?

Kamradt said Wraparound Milwaukee tracks presenting family issues and said a high rate of family substance abuse, parent incarceration, family mental illness and physical/sexual abuse is indicated.

* How are flex funds handled?

Kamradt said care coordination agencies front the money for authorized expenses and submit receipts for reimbursement. He said policies and procedures are in place and a fiscal intermediary agency is utilized.

* Did providers resist moving away from guaranteed contracts to a provider network system?

Kamradt said there was initial resistance. Providers were encouraged to re-engineer their service delivery and there is now a greater number of providers in the system. He said the move to a provider network system "leveled the playing field" for the small providers that had a difficult time competing with larger providers for contracts.

* How many family organizations does Wraparound Milwaukee contract with?

Kamradt said there is only one, noting Wraparound Milwaukee went out for bids.

* Does the Mobile Crisis Unit act as assessment?

Kamradt said it is one assessment tool. He said Wraparound Milwaukee also has assessment workers that are assigned to the courts.

Kamradt reported that Wraparound Milwaukee plans to target youth in juvenile corrections next.
