# 7) OLD BUSINESS:

- A. A construction and maintenance agreement with the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway Company. The agreement is for the replacement of the existing Firth Road at-grade crossing and construction of a new crossing at separated grades to be known as the Firth Viaduct, designated as Project C55-X-402(5) which is located at D.O.T. Crossing 083273X, more specifically located 500 feet west of the southeast corner of Section 27, Township 7 North, Range 7 East of the 6<sup>th</sup> Prime Meridian in Lancaster County, Nebraska. The existing Firth road at-grade crossing which D.O.T. Crossing 083273X shall be closed and removed upon completion of the construction and the opening of the new overpass. The total estimated cost to the County shall be \$24,707. (C-03-0041)
- B. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County Engineer to award a bid to Christensen Brothers, Inc., in the amount of \$1,694,781.31, for the construction of the Firth Viaduct; Project C55-X-402(5). (B-03-0004)

# 8) **NEW BUSINESS**:

- A. Adoption of a resolution approving the issuance, sale and delivery by Hospital Authority Number 1 Lancaster County, Nebraska in a total amount of \$19,000,000, with an initial amount of \$9,700,000, of its Hospital Revenue Bonds, Series 2003 (Grand Lodge Project).

The term of the agreement shall be from April 1, 2003 to March 31, 2007. The County shall pay \$170,000 per year for the services and an additional fee of \$1,700 per autopsy for any autopsy over 100 for the contract year. (C-03-0068)
- E. An addendum to an agreement with PayFlex Systems USA, Inc. for administering the County's Flexible Savings Account. The addendum addresses the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Privacy Regulations with respect to "business associates" as the term is definded by the HIPAA Privacy Regulations. - F. An addendum to an agreement with PayFlex Systems USA, Inc. for the County's Combined Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) administration. The addendum addresses the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Privacy Act (HIPAA) Privacy Regulations with respect to "business associates" as the term is defined by the HIPAA Privacy Regulations. - G. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County Engineer to award a bid to Hartmann Construction Company, in the amount of \$542,895.47, for grading construction in connection with County Project 03-30. (B-03-0008)
