- D. An agreement with the City of Lincoln for the paving and construction of the Cheney Connector which involves rerouting the current section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street into the town of Cheney, which will turn west and tie into a new arterial section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street. The City is responsible for the cost of paving and construction of the project and responsible for maintenance on the new section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street. The County shall give the City permission to perform the work and shall be responsible for maintenance on what is described as the Cheney Connection. (C-03-0304)
- E. A contract with Rochester Armored Car Company, Inc. for armored car services for Lancaster County and the City of Lincoln, at rates as specified in the Request for Proposal. The contract shall begin on July 1, 2003 and end June 30, 2006, with the option to renew for one additional three year period. (C-03-0305)
- F. A business associate agreement with Spectrum Rehabilitation Services, Inc./Spectrum Medical Equipment, Inc., and Lancaster County on behalf of Lancaster Manor. The agreement addresses the privacy regulations of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), with respect to "business associates" as that term is defined by the HIPAA Privacy Rules. The term of the agreement is from May 1, 2003 to April 30, 2004. The County shall pay licensed practical nurses from \$29.95 per hour to \$34.95 per hour and registered nurses from \$46.95 to \$52.95 per hour. - I. An agreement with Prairieland Dairy for the construction of a tunnel for moving cattle from one dairy barn to another on Pella Road between 120<sup>th</sup> and 134<sup>th</sup> Streets. Prairieland Dairy shall be responsible for construction and costs. The County shall give permission and authorize road closure.
