### 6) **OLD BUSINESS**:

A. An amendment to an agreement with the State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services for Comprehensive Community Mental Health Services for children and their families. The original agreement is under County Contract 99-2527 and two subsequent amendments under County Contracts C-00-106 and C-01-0020. The term of the agreement shall be amended to be from August 1, 1999 through August 31, 2003. The compensation shall be amended to increase to \$6,072,900 instead of \$5,178,562. (C-03-0307)

### 7) **NEW BUSINESS**:

- A. An interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration for electronic monitoring of up to 28 juveniles and two probation officers to supervise juveniles who are ordered by the Separate Juvenile Court of Lancaster County to pre-adjudication or predisposition monitoring during home detention. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall pay up to \$110,211 for the services. The County is also responsible for replacing lost or stolen monitors or transmitters. (C-03-0317)
- B. An interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration to facilitate the administration of the Drug Treatment Court for the District Court of Lancaster County through the provision of a Drug Treatment Court Coordinator, two Drug Treatment Court Probation Officers, a part-time Drug Technician and a Case Manager. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall pay up to \$158,939 for the services. (C-03-0318)
- C. An interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration for management of the Lancaster County Juvenile Drug Court through the provision of a Drug Court Coordinator, Drug Court Officer and electronic monitoring services. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall pay up to \$102,045. (C-03-0319)
- D. An application for a Special Designated License from Ken's Liquor, Inc. to hold a wedding reception on Saturday, August 2, 2003 from 3 p.m. to 1 a.m. at Grandpa John's, located at 4801 Northwest Highway 34, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska.

- F. An agreement with Nebraska Legal Services, Inc. for legal representation of indigent parents and juveniles in Juvenile Court proceedings in Lancaster County that are initiated pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-247(1), (2), (3)(a) and B, (4), (5), (6) and (8). The County shall pay \$256,000 per year for the services. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2005. (C-03-0308)
- G. An agreement with Lincoln Psychological Services, P.C. for a qualified, Board certified psychologist for mental health services at the Mental Health Center for citizens of Lancaster County. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall pay \$65 per hour for up to 45 hours per week. (C-03-0311)
- H. An agreement with Lisa Young for nurse practitioner services at the Community Mental Health Center to assist with psychiatric services to citizens of Lancaster County. The County shall pay \$50 per hour for up to 12 hours per week. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004. (C-03-0312)
- I. An agreement with Mary L. Paine, Ph.D. for services as psychologist to the Community Mental Health Center to assist with mental health services to citizens of Lancaster County. The County shall pay \$65 per hour for up to 40 hours per week. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004. (C-03-0313)
- J. An agreement with Susan Ugai for legal representation to indigent parties where they face contempt of court proceedings for failure to pay child support and in civil actions to establish paternity and determine child and medical support under Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-512.03 in the District Court of Lancaster County, Nebraska and before the child support referee. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2006. The County shall pay \$67,200 per year for the services. (C-03-0314)
- K. A sub-grant award agreement with Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) to develop a County strategy for Homeland Security. The grant amount is \$45,283.20. The period of performance is June 13, 2003 to September 1, 2003. (C-03-0316)

- N. An interlocal agreement with the City of Waverly for two Sheriff's deputies to provide law enforcement services within the corporate limits of the City of Waverly. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004 and shall be automatically renewed for a subsequent one year term unless otherwise terminated. The County shall be reimbursed up to \$115,807.64. (C-03-0321)
- O. An agreement with the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce for the establishment and maintenance of the Convention Visitors Bureau. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2008. The Lincoln Chamber of Commerce shall develop and submit an operating budget of the Convention Visitors Bureau by May 15<sup>th</sup> of each year of the contract for approval by the County Board. The County Board shall then fund the budget pursuant to statute. (C-03-0329)
- P. A grant contract with Active Community Treatments, Inc. for developmental disability services for residents of Lancaster County pursuant to statute. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall appropriate funds in an amount equal to the annual county per capita contribution required by Region V for disability services. The County shall pay a percentage of this amount to the Grantee which meets the percentage of services provided by Grantee in comparison to all providers for disability services in Lancaster County.
