## 6) OLD BUSINESS:

A. An agreement with Region V Systems for Emergency Protective Custody services at the Lancaster County Crisis Center. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. Region V shall enter into separate agreements with referring counties who will send acutely mentally ill individuals to Lancaster County. The County shall be paid \$106 per individual for the County fee and \$52 for the rural pool for each individual. (C-03-0361)

# 7) NEW BUSINESS:

- A. A grant contract with Heartland Big Brother/Big Sisters for funding for the mentoring program. The County will make a grant in the amount of \$12,500. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. (C-03-0473)
- B. A grant contract with Child Guidance Center for funding for outpatient services related to treatment intervention to help maintain the family system and enhance the level of functioning in children. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County will make a grant in the amount of \$30,000. (C-03-0474)
- C. A claim service and funding agreement with Specialty Risk Services, Inc. for claims services provided to the County. Term of the agreement is October 1, 2002 to October 1, 2003. The County will pay \$696 for each Bodily Injury claim, \$550 for each Property Damage claim under General Liability and \$1,626 for each Bodily Injury claim and \$41,191 for each Property Damage claim under Professional Liability. The County currently has an outstanding balance of \$4,322 which includes an annual administration fee of \$2,000. (C-03-0475)
- D. An agreement with Lincoln Area Agency on Aging's Lincoln Information for the Elderly (LAAA/LIFE) for mental health, substance abuse and aging services to frail elderly residents of Lancaster County. LAAA/LIFE will provide a Specialized Care Manager to work 40 hours per week to assist with these services. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County will pay \$52,400 for services outlined in the agreement. (C-03-0476)

### 7) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- E. An agreement with Progressive Medical Incorporated (PMI), an Ohio corporation, for products and services for a prescription drug program under workers' compensation. PMI has developed and operates a provider network by entering into agreements with ancillary pharmacy and other facilities to provide products and services to individuals covered under an applicable plan. Term of the agreement is from August 1, 2003 to July 31, 2004. The contractor will provide either invoices or an explanation of benefits depending upon the County's preference following the service or product delivery. (C-03-0477)
- F. An interlocal agreement with the Village of Raymond to assign addresses to residences in the Village's one-mile zoning jurisdiction in accordance with the County's Uniform Rural Address System. The County will have authority to assign addresses in the interest of public health, safety and welfare for each residence in the County. (C-03-0478)
- G. An affiliate amendment with the City of Lincoln and J.D. Edwards to add Lancaster County as an additional party to the agreement between parties for the purpose of obtaining access and support of J.D. Edwards One World Software. The County will have the right to use licenses which have previously been purchased by the City. (C-03-0481)
- H. A memorandum of understanding with the City of Lincoln for the allocation of costs related to the County's use of licenses obtained by the City from J.D. Edwards. The County will pay 66b percent of the maintenance costs in the years 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008. The County will pay 33a percent of the maintenance costs for the year 2009. The County will receive 15 concurrent users for the One World Software. (C-03-0482)
- A resolution authorizing the installation of "No Parking" signs on North 98<sup>th</sup> Street north of Benton Street in the vicinity of the Murdock Trail for northbound and southbound traffic. (R-03-0094)
