An agreement with Interactive Alliance: Connecting People, Purpose and Process to provide professional services for neutral facilitation of meetings with a focus on the goals of the Families First and Foremost program. Term of the agreement is from October 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County will pay up to \$15,000. (C-03-0635)
- B. A grant contract with CASA for Lancaster County to provide funding for the Court Appointed Special Advocates Program, which provides advocacy for abused and neglected children in Lancaster County. Term of the contract is July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The amount of the grant is \$20,000 of which \$10,000 is to be considered as a one-time special project funding. (C-03-0613)

- A. Election of Chair and Vice Chair for the Lancaster County Board of Commissioners for 2004.
- B. Region V Network Provider contract for services under the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH). The County, through the services of the Community Mental Health Center, would provide outreach services, community mental health services, screening and diagnostic services. Term of the agreement is October 1, 2003 to September 30, 2004. The County will be compensated up to \$32,500 for the services and the County will provide up to \$10,833. (C-03-0654)
- C. An agreement between the State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services and Lancaster County in which the County will act as fiscal and administrative agent for Families First and Foremost. Term of the agreement is September 1, 2003 to August 31, 2004. The Department agrees to pay the County up to \$1,696,091.06 for the services. (C-03-0655)
- D. A lease agreement between Lancaster County, on behalf of Emergency Management, and the Airport Authority of the City of Lincoln, for the lease of approximately 2,625 square feet of Building Number 300 in Lincoln Air Park West. The lease agreement begins January 1, 2004 and continues monthly thereafter, with a 30 day termination provision. The County will pay \$656.25 per month for the premises. (C-03-0656)
- E. An agreement with Child Guidance Center for five full-time care coordinators within the Integrated Care Coordination Unit (I.C.C.U.). Term of the agreement is December 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County will pay up to \$125,565 for these services. (C-03-0661)
- F. An agreement with Amanda Fichter of Advantage Word Processing for the indexing and data processing of microfilm records of the County Surveyor's Office. Term of the agreement is November 1, 2003 to October 30, 2004, with a 30 day termination provision. The County will pay up to \$2,000 for these services. (C-03-0662)
- G. A resolution in the matter of designating banks as depositories for Lancaster County for 2004. (R-03-0132)
