The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of the minutes of

carried.

2) PUBLIC COMMENT:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

3) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, January 21, 2003.

4) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An application for a special events permit from the 2003 Animal Run to hold a fund raiser on Saturday, February 1, 2003, from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. in Hickman, Nebraska.

Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of an application for a special events permit from the 2003 Animal Run to hold a fund raiser on Saturday, February 1, 2003, from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. in Hickman, Nebraska. Workman, Hudkins, Schorr, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An application for a special events permit from Junior's Cycling Productions to hold a bicycle race around Branched Oak Lake on Saturday, April 12, 2003 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. The race will begin near Liebers Point on the west side of Branched Oak Lake and proceed west on Branched Oak Road, turning north on Northwest 140th Street circling the lake.

David Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, appeared and requested that any motion which the Board may make pertaining to the application be subject to the inclusion of a release of the County from any liability.

In response to a question asked by Hudkins, John Lefler, Jr., applicant, explained that the race would begin and end at Lieber's Point. He also indicated there would be an off-duty sheriff's deputy and one volunteer to enforce traffic control.

Stevens asked Lefler if he objected to any of the recommendations made by the County Engineer, Sheriff or the Health Department.

Lefler stated he would not object.

In response to a question asked by Schorr regarding an executed hold harmless agreement, Lefler responded that he was waiting on a certificate of insurance from USA Cycling Group.

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4) NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

MOTION:

Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of an application for a special events permit from Junior's Cycling Productions to hold a bicycle race around Branched Oak Lake on Saturday, April 12, 2003 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. subject to the following: 1) a release of the County from any liability, 2) execution by Junior's Cycling Productions of the hold harmless agreement, 3) compliance with conditions as outlined by the County Engineer, Sheriff and Health Department and 4) receipt of a certificate of insurance. C. An agreement with Child Advocacy Center to provide an environment for interviews and medical examinations of children who are suspected of being victims of child abuse in Lancaster County. The County shall pay \$20,000 for the services. The County Attorney and Sheriff's Office shall contribute equally. The term of the agreement is from October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003. (C-03-0032)

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Stevens seconded approval of an agreement with Child Advocacy Center to provide an environment for interviews and medical examinations of children who are suspected of being victims of child abuse in Lancaster County. The County shall pay \$20,000 for the services. Stevens, Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

D. A grant contract with Southeast Community College for English Language Training Services to 140 refugee participants using employment related software. The funds expended were received from the Federal Targeted Assistance Grant. The County shall make a grant in the amount of \$52,891 for the services. The term of the agreement is from October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003. (C-03-0035)

MOTION:

Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of a grant contract with Southeast Community College for English Language Training Services to 140 refugee participants using employment related software. Heier, Workman, Hudkins, Schorr and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

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4) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED**:

E. A construction and maintenance agreement with the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway Company. The agreement is for the replacement of the existing Firth Road at-grade crossing and construction of a new crossing at separated grades to be known as the Firth Viaduct, designated as Project C55-X-402(5) which is located at D.O.T. Crossing 083273X, more specifically located 500 feet west of the southeast corner of Section 27, Township 7 North, Range 7 East of the 6th Prime Meridian in Lancaster County, Nebraska. The existing Firth road at-grade crossing which D.O.T. Crossing 083273X shall be closed and removed upon completion of the construction and the opening of the new overpass. The total estimated cost to the County shall be \$24,707. (C-03-0041)

This item was held at the request of the County Attorney's Office.

F. An addendum to an agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration for the provision of services for the Drug Treatment Court in Lancaster County. The original agreement was under Contract C-02-0533. The addendum provides for additional compensation by the County, in the amount of \$214.16 for additional expenses in the area of cell phone usage, mileage and electronic monitoring. (C-03-0040)

MOTION: Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of an addendum to an agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration for the provision of services for the Drug Treatment Court in Lancaster County. Heier, Workman, Stevens and Schorr voted aye. Hudkins voted no. Motion carried.
