The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of the minutes of

the Board of Commissioners meeting dated January 28, 2003. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

2) PUBLIC COMMENT:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

3) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, February 4, 2003.

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of all claims

processed through February 4, 2003. Workman, Heier, Schorr and

Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

4) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An agreement with Educational Service District 101 for Corrections Learning Network (CLN) programming for the Lancaster County Corrections Department. Educational Service District 101 shall provide the County with a satellite dish and programming for inmates and staff. The County shall provide the Educational Service District 101 with information regarding school enrollment and classroom size. The term of the agreement is from the date of execution until August 31, 2003. (C-03-0046)

David Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, gave a brief explanation regarding the agreement, noting that it doesn't include the standard language which the County uses. He added that the agreement also does not include the standard liability which the County uses, however, it is felt that there is little or no exposure with regard to liability because Educational Service District 101 would be sending the County a satellite dish and the County would be receiving CLN programming via the satellite.

MOTION: Workman moved and Schorr seconded approval of an agreement

with Educational Service District 101 for Corrections Learning Network (CLN) programming for the Lancaster County Corrections Department. Workman, Hudkins, Schorr and Heier voted aye.

Motion carried.

B. An amendment to an agreement with Cole Layer Trumble for support and maintenance of the OASIS software. The amendment adds additional language regarding liability. (C-03-0049)

The Clerk indicated that the amendment would be held at the request of the County Attorney's Office.

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4) <u>NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:</u>

C. A renewal application with the State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services for a license for the Community Mental Health Center to operate as a 15 inpatient bed mental health center. The County shall pay \$200 in renewal fees. The current license expires February 28, 2003. (C-03-0045)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Hudkins seconded approval of a renewal

application with the State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services for a license for the Community Mental Health Center to operate as a 15 inpatient bed mental health center. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

D. An organization provider application with Magellan Behavioral Health, Inc. for reimbursement of services provided by the Community Mental Health Center of Lancaster County. Once the application is approved the County shall receive an agreement for Board approval. (C-03-0047)

Hudkins moved and Schorr seconded approval of an organization provider application with Magellan Behavioral Health, Inc. for reimbursement of services provided by the Community Mental Health Center of Lancaster County. Heier, Workman, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried.

E. Certificate of Authority for Wells Fargo Bank authorizing Bernie Heier, as the County Board Chair, and Bruce Medcalf, as the County Clerk, to sign on behalf of the County for transactions on both of its accounts with the bank. (C-03-0044)

Johnson explained that the County previously entered into a Master Services Agreement with Wells Fargo Bank. He stated the certificate of authority relates to the County's account, and the provisions, as outlined in the Master Services Agreement, apply to the County's account, as well as the certificate of authority.

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4) NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

Johnson requested the County Board to accept the following in Subsection 3, by deleting "copy of the Bank's documents" and inserting "Master Services Agreement" and in Subsection 7 deleting "an agreement" and inserting "the Master Services Agreement". He added that he spoke with Jan Sheridan, a representative with Wells Fargo Bank, who indicated there would not be a problem with the changes. Johnson also requested that the Chair initial those changes.

Hudkins moved and Workman seconded to authorize Bernie Heier, as the County Board Chair, to sign on behalf of the County for transactions on both accounts with Wells Fargo Bank, including the interlineations as outlined by the Deputy County Attorney and to authorize Bruce Medcalf, as the County Clerk, to sign on behalf of the County for transactions on both accounts with the bank. Schorr, Workman, Heier and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

F. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County Engineer to award a bid to Christensen Brothers, Inc., in the amount of \$1,694,781.31, for the construction of the Firth Viaduct; Project C55-X-402(5). (B-03-0004)

Don Thomas, County Engineer, appeared and stated he received a telephone call from Concrete Industries, who will be supplying the concrete girders, offering "value engineering". Thomas explained that Concrete Industries has new technology which they would like to recommend and would do a redesign of the bridge, at their expense, to determine if there is a way to save money. If they determine that there is a way to save money, Concrete Industries would then deduct their engineering costs from the savings and split it between the County and themselves.

Thomas requested that the award be placed on pending until the contract with the railroad is completed.

By direction of the Chair, the award of bid to Christensen Brothers, Inc., in the amount of \$1,694,781.31, for the construction of the Firth Viaduct; Project C55-X-402(5) was placed pending.

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4) NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

- G. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County Engineer to award a bid to SCS Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$14,450, for crack sealing at the following locations: (B-03-0005)

 - On South 68th Street from Princeton Road north two miles to Panama Road
