2) PUBLIC COMMENT:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**:

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6) **PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:**

The Chair opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

Workman asked Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, if there had been any problems with any of the establishments.

Wagner responded that there had been violations by certain licensees but, there would have to be three violations in a one year period in order to request the licensee(s) to complete a long form. He said none of the licensees have had three or more violations.

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Schorr seconded to grant the automatic renewal of retail liquor and beer licenses issued in Lancaster County and outside the corporate limits of any city, pursuant to Resolution 5351 adopted July 2, 1995 for which the County Clerk has received no protests. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. A petition from ten percent of the property owners within the Yankee Ridge Subdivision for formation of a Special Paving Improvement District for the paving of Rebel Drive, South 60th Street, South 61st Court, South 63rd Street, Marlyn Road, South 64th Circle, South 65th Street, Bolton Road, South 66th Street and South 68th Street, all located within the Yankee Ridge Subdivision. The proposed District shall be called the Yankee Ridge Road Improvement District.

The Chair opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to testify in favor of the proposal.

The Clerk administered the oath to J. Michael Rierden, attorney representing the petitioners.

Rierden gave a brief explanation of the procedure and requested that the petition for formation of the Special Paving Improvement District and accompanying map be made a part of the record (Exhibit 1).

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6) PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:

Rierden also distributed a map outlining the paving improvement district (Exhibit 2).

In response to a question asked by Workman, Rierden stated there had been no opposition to the paving district.

The Clerk administered the oath to Don Thomas, County Engineer.

Thomas stated that his office had no objections to the boundaries as outlined.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

It was noted that action would be taken on March 11, 2003.

7) OLD BUSINESS:

A. A Region V network provider contract for services under the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH). The County, through the services of the Community Mental Health Center, would provide outreach services, community mental health services and screening and diagnostic services. The term of the agreement is October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003. The County shall be paid up to \$32,500 for the services. The County will provide up to \$10,833. (C-02-0566)

David Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, appeared and referred to Page 6, Section 6A-3 of the contract explaining that his office has concerns regarding the clause that the County must submit to the jurisdiction of Public Counsel.

Johnson stated he had talked to Sam Kaplan with the legal department of Health and Human Services, who indicated to him he would look into the matter. It was noted that no update has been received from Mr. Kaplan.

Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center Administrator, appeared and stated if the County Board does not approve the contract soon, the County will lose the money and it will be redirected to Region VI. He also stated that the scope of work, as outlined in the contract, has been completed.

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7) OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

MOTION: Workman moved and Schorr seconded approval of a Region V

network provider contract for services under the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH). The County, through the services of the Community Mental Health Center, would provide outreach services, community mental health services and screening and diagnostic services. Schorr, Workman and Heier voted

aye. Hudkins abstained from voting. Motion carried.

8) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An agreement with HIPAA Academy for training and consulting services relating to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). The cost of the services shall not exceed \$10,000 plus the cost of training manuals and certification exams. Additional consulting services are available at the hourly rates stated in the agreement. (C-03-0069)

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement with HIPAA Academy for training and consulting services relating to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). The cost of the services shall not exceed \$10,000 plus the cost of training manuals and certification exams. Additional consulting services are available at the hourly rates stated in the agreement. Hudkins, Workman, Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An agreement with United Healthcare setting forth rates for the employee health insurance plan for the plan year beginning January 1, 2003 and ending December 31, 2003. (C-03-0070)

Johnson requested that the proposal and policy guidelines be made a part of the agreement on file in the County Clerk's Office

In response to a question asked by Hudkins, Diane Staab, Deputy County Attorney, explained that the rates were a result of the request for proposal (RFP) which was completed last spring. She stated the County is locked into the plan and rates for the calendar year. If the plan were to be changed, it would have to be negotiated with United Healthcare for the following year.

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MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement with United Healthcare setting forth rates for the employee health insurance plan for the plan year beginning January 1, 2003 and ending December 31, 2003. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

C. An agreement with Great Plains Appraisal Company for supervision and coordination of valuation protests filed for the 2003 tax year and appearing before Lancaster County Board of Equalization. The coordinator is also responsible for ensuring that all papers related to such protests along with written findings and recommendations are made available to the Board. The referee coordinator shall be reimbursed at a rate of \$680 per working day up to \$96,000. (C-03-0078)

MOTION:

Schorr moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement with Great Plains Appraisal Company for supervision and coordination of valuation protests filed for the 2003 tax year and appearing before Lancaster County Board of Equalization. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

- D. A contract with Sealcoat Service, Inc. d/b/a SCS Construction Company of Omaha, Nebraska to provide services on County Project 03-29 for cracking sealing at the following locations:
 - Firth Road from Highway 77 east 10.9 miles to Highway 43 except for a 0.5 mile portion of Firth Road west of Everett Street (in Firth).
 - ► Hallam Road from Southwest 100th Street east 3.5 miles to the Village of Hallam.
 - ► Panama Road from South 68th Street east 6.3 miles to the Village of Panama.
 - ► South 68th Street from Princeton Road north 2 miles to Panama Road.

The County shall pay \$14,450 for the services. The work shall be performed between February 17, 2003 to April 18, 2003. (C-03-0079)

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MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of a contract with

Sealcoat Service, Inc. d/b/a SCS Construction Company of Omaha, Nebraska to provide services on County Project 03-29 for crack sealing at various locations within the County. Hudkins, Workman,

Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

E. A grant contract with Family Service Association, Inc. for funding for the development of three Families and Schools Together (FAST) programs. The County shall make a grant in the amount of \$21,600. The term of the grant contract is October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003. (C-03-0080)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of a grant contract

with Family Service Association, Inc. for funding for the development of three Families and Schools Together (FAST) programs. The County shall make a grant in the amount of \$21,600. The term of the grant contract is October 1, 2002 to September 30, 2003.

Schorr clarified that the name Family Service Association (FAST) was changed to Connecting Families and Schools (CFAS).

Johnson requested that approval of the agreement be with the addition of the following clause: "Whereas, the County was granted a Sub-Recipient Award FY2002 Supplemental Funding Grant for Community Emergency Response Team Training, by the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency which authorized the County to conduct training throughout the State and also provided funding for said training.".

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MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement

with Reynolds Davis for the provision of services as a Project Manager for the provision of the Community Emergency Response Team program and training. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Heier

voted aye. Motion carried.

G. Authorization for Gary Lacey as the Lancaster County Attorney to sign a user agreement with the Nebraska State Patrol to connect with the Combined Law Enforcement Network for the exchange of criminal justice related information between the system and the County Attorney's Office. The agreement allows access and use of National Crime Information Center and the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System functions which includes administrative messages and criminal history records. (C-03-0081)

MOTION: Workman moved and Schorr seconded approval to authorize Gary

Lacey as the Lancaster County Attorney to sign a user agreement with the Nebraska State Patrol to connect with the Combined Law Enforcement Network for the exchange of criminal justice related information between the system and the County Attorney's Office. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

H. Application from Lancaster County to the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality regarding Phase II of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Small MS4 permit.

Doug Pillard, Design Division Head of the County Engineering Department, appeared and briefly explained the application. He stated a waiver was requested through the Department of Environmental Quality, however, they indicated they could not act on it prior to March 10th which is the deadline for returning the application. Pillard noted that the Department of Environmental Quality did indicate they would act on the waiver before reviewing the application.

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, appeared and requested that the motion include sending a cover letter requesting that action be taken on the waiver prior to acting on the permit.
