The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, April 1, 2003.

**MOTION:** Hudkins moved and Stevens seconded approval of the minutes of the

Board of Commissioners meeting dated April 1, 2003. Schorr,

Hudkins, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

#### 2) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**:

A. Household Hazardous Waste Collections Program - Beth Mann, Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department

Nancy Clark, Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department, appeared and gave a brief overview of the program, noting that it began 17 years ago. She stated their focus is on education so that individuals understand the hazards in relation to the materials they have and use in their homes.

#### 2) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS CONTINUED:**

Clark addressed funding by stating that the occupation tax will be an important part of their funding in the future. She added that they have also been successful in applying to the State Department of Environmental Quality, through the Waste Reduction and Recycling Grant Fund, for grants to assist with the collections. Clark stated they also have partnerships with two Lincoln businesses, Goodyear and Pfizer, who have been very helpful.

Beth Mann, Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department, appeared and gave a brief explanation regarding the following documentation:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

Andy Reetz, General Manager for Hillcrest Country Club, appeared and stated they had been holding the golf events for the past five years and would like to continue. He stated that, according to State liquor laws, liquor cannot be served on Sunday mornings, however, the Special Designated License(s) would allow them to do so.

Discussion took place regarding a discrepancy relating to the time of the events.

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, clarified that one of the applications does indicate a time of 7 a.m. to 1 p.m., with the remaining five applications indicating a time of 7 a.m. to 1 a.m..

Wagner also noted that it has been the recommendation of the Sheriff's Office to approve the applications for the past several years. He indicated there have been no problems in the past.

#### MOTION:

Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of applications for Special Designated Licenses from Hillcrest Country Club, located at 8901 "O" Street, to hold golfing events from 7 a.m. to 1 a.m. on Sunday, May 4, 2003, Sunday, May 25, 2003, Sunday, June 1, 2003, Sunday, July 6, 2003, Sunday, August 3, 2003 and on Sunday, August 17, 2003.

**FRIENDLY AMENDMENT:** Schorr offered a friendly amendment to change the times for the dates as specified on the applications to be 7 a.m. to 12 p.m.

The maker of the motion agreed.

**ROLL CALL:** Hudkins, Stevens, Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

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#### 6) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. Applications for Special Designated Licenses from Crooked Creek Golf Club, located at 333 South 134<sup>th</sup> Street, golf tournaments on Sunday, May 18, 2003 from 7 a.m. to 12 p.m. and on Sunday, June 8, 2003 from 7 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Ryan Rosentiel, General Manager for Crooked Creek Golf Club, appeared to answer any questions.

MOTION:

Schorr moved and Hudkins seconded approval of applications for Special Designated Licenses from Crooked Creek Golf Club, located at 333 South 134<sup>th</sup> Street, golf tournaments on Sunday, May 18, 2003 from 7 a.m. to 12 p.m. and on Sunday, June 8, 2003 from 7 a.m. to 12 p.m. Stevens, Schorr, Hudkins and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An agreement with The Recovery Center for substance abuse evaluations and clinical supervision of individuals being trained to provide substance abuse evaluations at the Lancaster County Assessment Center. The term of the agreement is from March 1, 2003 to March 1, 2004. The County shall pay \$150 per hour per evaluation and \$35 per hour for supervisory and training services. Total compensation shall not exceed \$20,000. (C-03-0127)

Renee Dozier, Families First and Foremost Associate Director, noted that the fee should be \$150 per evaluation, not per hour per evaluation.

Gus Hitz, Assessment Center Director, gave a brief overview of the agreement with The Recovery Center.

In response to a question asked by Schorr regarding the number of evaluations to be conducted in a one year period, Hitz stated they have never performed the work before, however, they do know, through discussions with Juvenile Court and Probation, that there is a tremendous need for them. He stated he believed they would be looking at, at least, 15 evaluations per Juvenile Court judge.

Hitz also noted that he had not received the certificate of insurance, however, coverage should be in place by Wednesday, April 9<sup>th</sup>.

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In response to a question asked by Hudkins regarding the insurance, David Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, recommended that the Board's approval be subject to receiving the certificate of insurance.

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Stevens seconded approval of an agreement with The Recovery Center for substance abuse evaluations and clinical supervision of individuals being trained to provide substance abuse evaluations at the Lancaster County Assessment Center subject to receipt of a certificate of insurance. Stevens, Hudkins, Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

C. Acceptance of the terms and conditions of a provider user agreement with Magellan Behavioral Health Services. Magellan processes claims from the Mental Health Center. Magellan shall provide us access to information relating to claims, clinical document submission, documents related to billing, provider related processes through their website. (C-03-0125)

This item was held at the request of the County Attorney's Office.

D. A notice of cancellation of an agreement with the Asian Community Center for a care coordinator and related services for juveniles who are wards of the State of Nebraska. The agreement is under County Contract Number C-02-0490 and has a 60 day notice requirement. The effective date of cancellation shall be June 13, 2003.

Renee Dozier, Families First and Foremost Associate Director, indicated they haven't requested services since January 20, 2003.

MOTION:

Schorr moved and Hudkins seconded approval of a notice of cancellation of an agreement with the Asian Community Center for a care coordinator and related services for juveniles who are wards of the State of Nebraska. The agreement is under County Contract Number C-02–0490 and has a 60 day notice requirement. The effective date of cancellation shall be June 13, 2003. Hudkins, Stevens, Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

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E. Payment of \$1,446.92 to Seacrest & Kalkowski, P.C. for moderator services for a Community Services Implementation Plan meeting. Payment represents one-third of the total bill, with the remaining two-thirds being paid by the City of Lincoln and United Way.

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, appeared and gave a brief explanation regarding the moderator services and noted that the City has already made their one-third payment.

MOTION:

Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of payment of \$1,446.92 to Seacrest & Kalkowski, P.C. for moderator services for a Community Services Implementation Plan meeting. Payment represents one-third of the total bill, with the remaining two-thirds being paid by the City of Lincoln and United Way. Stevens, Hudkins, Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

- F. A resolution authorizing the following traffic signs in Lancaster County, Nebraska: (R-03-0015)
  - ► Install a "STOP AHEAD" sign in advance of the existing "STOP" sign on Alvo Road approximately 500 feet east of North 162<sup>nd</sup> Street for westbound traffic.
  - ► Remove the "CHILDREN AT PLAY" signs installed under County Resolution 99-1989 located on West Wittstruck Road, one east of Southwest 114<sup>th</sup> Street for westbound traffic and one, one-half mile west of Southwest 114<sup>th</sup> Street for eastbound traffic.

Hudkins inquired why the "Children At Play" signs were being removed.

Larry Worrell, Chief Deputy County Surveyor, explained that the property had been sold and children no longer reside at that location.

Diane Staab, Deputy County Attorney, appeared and addressed the resolution, noting the following components:

- ► Designation of Lancaster County as a hybrid entity to separate the agencies which work with health care versus those agencies that do not.
- Adopts privacy policies which will begin April 14, 2003.
- ► Appointment of Privacy Officer(s) at the Community Mental Health Center and Lancaster Manor.

Hudkins moved and Stevens seconded approval of Resolution 03-0017 in the matter of designating Lancaster County as a hybrid entity, appointing a privacy officer(s) and adopting policies regarding the confidentiality of protected health information pursuant to the administrative simplification provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996. Hudkins, Stevens, Schorr and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.
