The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, August 5, 2003.

**MOTION:** Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of the minutes of

the Board of Commissioners meeting dated August 5, 2003. Workman, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

#### 2) **PUBLIC COMMENT**:

Bob Valentine, 2660 Park Avenue, appeared and asked if the County would take full advantage of the re-valuation or if they would adjust the mill levy rate downward.

Heier responded that wouldn't be known until the budget is adopted.

Workman stated the Board did vote on the proposed budget and it appears that the property tax request from the taxpayers will increase approximately 14 percent.

Heier added that the full Board did vote on the proposed budget, however, it was not unanimous.

#### 3) **CLAIMS FOR REVIEW:**

A. Payment Voucher 782-4189, dated August 4, 2003 - Juvenile Mental Health (Families First and Foremost) has requested payment to Family Services Association, in the amount of \$6,078.63, for June payment on County Contract C-02-0479. This will bring the total paid on said contract above the contracted amount.

Renee Dozier, Office of Juvenile Mental Health, requested the claim for review be held until additional information is received from the provider.

By direction of the Chair, the claim for review (Payment Voucher 782-4189) was held.

4) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, August 12, 2003.

#### 5) OLD BUSINESS:

A. An agreement with Randall Funding & Development, Inc. for professional services to raise grant funds for Lancaster County. The contractor shall write grant applications to obtain at least \$1,000,000 in grant approvals for the County. The County will provide the contractor with authorization to apply for a minimum of \$3,500,000 in grant opportunities. (C-02-0232)

**MOTION**: Workman r

Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of an agreement with Randall Funding & Development, Inc. for professional services to raise grant funds for Lancaster County. The contractor shall write grant applications to obtain at least \$1,000,000 in grant approvals for the County. Stevens, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

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#### 5) OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

B. An agreement with the City of Lincoln for the paving and construction of the Cheney Connector which involves rerouting the current section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street into the town of Cheney, which will turn west and tie into a new arterial section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street. The City is responsible for the cost of paving and construction of the project and responsible for maintenance on the new section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street. The County shall give the City permission to perform the work and shall be responsible for maintenance on what is described as the Cheney Connection. (C-03-0304)

David Johnson, Deputy County Attorney, explained that the agreement was held for the inclusion of additional language as requested by his office. He indicated that the language has been provided for through an amendment which appears under New Business.

#### MOTION:

Stevens moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement with the City of Lincoln for the paving and construction of the Cheney Connector which involves rerouting the current section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street into the town of Cheney, which will turn west and tie into a new arterial section of South 91<sup>st</sup> Street. Stevens, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

- C. An agreement with the City of Lincoln for medical services 24 hours a day to be provided through the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall pay based upon the following rates: (C-03-0357)
  - % A single monthly fee of \$621.43 per month for round the clock availability of professional services.
  - % A sum of \$45,575, payable in 12 monthly payments of \$3,797.92, for one full-time registered nurse provided for under the agreement.
  - % A sum of \$11,310 for a part-time, on-call registered nurse.
  - \$78.60 per physician's visit to the Juvenile Detention Center.
  - % \$8.41 per telephone conversation with the physician.
  - % Physical examination/assessment completed at actual cost.
  - \$35 per dose of Hepatitis B vaccine for each employee.
  - % \$10 per tuberculosis test for each employee.
  - % \$20 employment assessment for each employee.

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#### 5) OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

- % \$40 per hour for on-site lab services by a lab technician.
- % Should the County Attorney's Office require conferences, meetings, or incourt testimony of nurses, it shall be billed to the County at the rate of \$42.50 per hour.
- % Should the County Attorney's Office require conferences, meetings or incourt testimony of physicians, it shall be billed to the County at the rate of \$78.60 per hour.

**MOTION:**

The term of the agreement is July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. Stevens, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

Pat Lloyd, Nebraska State Fair General Manager, appeared and gave an overview of the application stating that the event is an educational program, not only in the process of wine making, but it's role in Nebraska's agricultural economy.

In response to a question asked by Stevens regarding location, Lloyd indicated the area is catty-corner from the 4-H building.

D. Supplemental agreement number 1 with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for Project BR-3280(3), which is Sprague East and County Structure T-109. The County previously entered into a program agreement with the State regarding this project on November 5, 2002. Due to a change in the State-Aid bridge funds it is necessary to supplement the agreement. The Federal aid remains at 80 percent, but the State aid shall be five percent and the County will pay 15 percent of the costs. All other terms and conditions of the original agreement still apply. (C-03-0401)

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**MOTION:** Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of supplemental

agreement number 1 with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for Project BR-3280(3), which is Sprague East and County Structure T-109. Workman, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion

carried.

E. An agreement with Frontier Insurance and Randall Funding and Development, Inc. to recognize the use of Randall Funding and Development to satisfy the terms of the insurance bond of which Frontier is the surety. The agreement recognizes that the County has reserved the right to demand performance under the bond if the services bargained for are not provided. The County was to originally receive grant writing services from Griffin Grant Writing. (C-03-0440)

MOTION:

Stevens moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement with Frontier Insurance and Randall Funding and Development, Inc. to recognize the use of Randall Funding and Development to satisfy the terms of the insurance bond of which Frontier is the surety. Workman, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

F. A network provider agreement with Region V Human Service Program for certain mental health, alcoholism, substance abuse and related behavioral mental health services at the Community Mental Health Center. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The County shall be reimbursed up to \$4,367,865 for the services. (C-03-0399)

By direction of the Chair, the agreement was held.

G. An agreement with Barb A. Baier for professional services in the areas of grant writing and program development on behalf of the Office of Juvenile Mental Health. The term of the agreement is from July 14, 2003 to May 1, 2004. The County shall pay up to \$50,000 for the services. (C-03-0416)

By direction of the Chair, the agreement was held.

H. An amendment to an agreement with the City of Lincoln for the Cheney Connection Project which was approved by the City on June 6, 2003. The amendment requires the City to accept control of the construction area for which they are responsible during the construction project. (C-03-0398)

Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of an amendment to an agreement with the City of Lincoln for the Cheney Connection Project which was approved by the City on June 6, 2003. Stevens, Workman and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

 A resolution approving an agreement between the Public Building Commission and Woods Brothers Realtors for the purchase of real estate described as 805 "H" Street. The real estate shall be used for additional parking for the County and City and will cost \$73,900, the proceeds for which will come from the parking garage bonds. (R-03-0072)

MOTION:

Stevens moved and Workman seconded approval of Resolution 03-0072 approving an agreement between the Public Building Commission and Woods Brothers Realtors for the purchase of real estate described as 805 "H" Street. The real estate shall be used for additional parking for the County and City and will cost \$73,900, the proceeds for which will come from the parking garage bonds. Workman, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.

These signs will be on the posted detour for the Firth Viaduct and will be removed when the project is completed and Firth Road is reopened.

K. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County Records and Information Manager to award a bid to Prescott Heald & Son, Inc. for archival record storage shelving. The project will be split into two phases due to budget concerns. Phase I, in the amount of \$9,074, will be ordered and installed in the 2003-2004 budget year. Phase II, in the amount of \$6,971, will be proposed as part of the 2004-2005 budget allocations. An additional \$250 will be charged over the base bid to cover splitting the order and paying for two separate shipments and installations. (B-03-0019)

John Swenson, Cornhusker State Industries, appeared and expressed his concerns regarding the bidding procedure.

Kathy Smith, Assistant Purchasing Agent, explained the bidding procedure using the life cycle cost analysis. She said everyone went through the same process and it was determined that Prescott Heald was the low bidder.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Workman seconded to award a bid to Prescott Heald & Son, Inc. for archival record storage shelving, in the amount of \$15,785. Workman, Stevens and Heier voted aye. Motion carried.
