#### 2) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**:

- A. Presentation of the County-City Volunteer of the Month Award to Kathleen Uhrmacher for her services with the Lincoln-Lancaster Women's Commission.
- 3) <u>PUBLIC COMMENT:</u> The public comment period is limited to thirty (30 minutes) in duration and each speaker is limited to five (5) minutes. These time limits may be extended at the discretion of the County Board Chair. Comments shall be limited to items on the agenda.
- 4) **CLAIMS:** Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, January 6, 2004.

#### 5) **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A. County Special Permit 189A, requested by Christian Heritage Children's Home, to amend the previously approved special permit by expanding the office building from 7,000 square feet to 9,800 square feet and to allow up to 32 full-time equivalent employees (previously approved for 16 employees) on property generally located at South 148th Street and Old Cheney Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska.

#### 6) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An agreement terminating County contract C-03-0346 with St. Monica's Home which provides behavioral health services to high need youth who are wards of the State. The County and St. Monica's agree that it is mutually beneficial to terminate the agreement effective January 9, 2004. (C-04-0001)

#### 6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- B. An agreement with Polsky, Shiffermiller and Coe for the representation of indigent parents and juveniles in Juvenile Court proceedings pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-247(1), (2), (3)(a) and (b), (4), (5), (6) and (8). Term of the agreement is from January 1, 2004 to December 31, 2006. The County will pay \$165,570 for the services provided. (C-04-0002)
- C. An interlocal agreement with Saunders County for the safekeeping, care and sustenance of juveniles while at the Lancaster County Juvenile Detention Center. Lancaster County will be reimbursed \$213 per youth, per day from Saunders County. The agreement is effective upon execution by both parties and has a 30 day termination provision. (C-04-0003)
- D. A signature amendment for Wells Fargo Bank authorizing Ray Stevens, as the County Board Chair, to sign on behalf of the County for transactions on both of its accounts with the bank. The amendment also deletes Bernie Heier as an authorized signer for the accounts. (C-04-0004)
- E. An amendment to County Contract No. C-03-0378 with Amanda Andrae which provides for professional services to assist with the implementation and management of program evaluation and the monitoring of activities established within the Quality Assurance Plan for programs under the Office of Juvenile Mental Health. The amendment provides for a three (3) month contract extension. The County shall pay an additional \$15,000 for the extension. (C-04-0005)
- F. An agreement with Julie Poykko-Post to update the designated baseline data on two previous Legalized Gambling Impact Studies for the County and make recommendations based on the collection and analysis of this data. The term of the agreement is January 1, 2004 through March 31, 2004. The County shall pay \$2,000 for these services. (C-04-0006)
- G. A resolution concurring with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads to award Federal Aid Project STPE-3265(6), Hickman North to Pavers Companies, in the amount of \$1,329,000. (R-04-0001)
- H. A resolution adopting an amendment to the Lancaster County Deferred Compensation Plan to conform with the final 457 Treasury regulations issued in July, 2003. (R-04-0002)

#### 6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- I. A resolution approving County Special Permit No. 189A, requested by Christian Heritage Children's Home, to amend County Special Permit No. 189 to expand the office building to 9,800 square feet and allow up to 32 full-time equivalent employees on property generally located at South 148th Street and Old Cheney Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (R-04-0003)
- J. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the Emergency Management Director to award a bid to purchase radios, mobile systems and repeaters for first responders to RACOM Corporation. This will be an award of \$709,171.45 using grant funds obtained by the Emergency Management Department. (B-04-0001)
- K. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the Emergency Management Director to award a bid to purchase radio batteries for first responders to Multiplier Industries. This will be an award of \$14,560 using grant funds obtained by the Emergency Management Department. (B-04-0002)
