- C. A conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Fred L. and Connie Barry for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 39.7 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The City and County will jointly contribute \$71,000 for the easement conveyance. (C-04-0027)
- D. A conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Bruce D. and Karen Tiedeman for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 127.8 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The City and County will jointly contribute \$215,000 for the easement conveyance. (C-04-0032).
- E. A conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Beverly A. Tiedeman and Bruce D. and Karen Tiedeman for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 26.9 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).
