- B. Conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Eugene and Jeanette M. Theer for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 39.71 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The City and County will jointly contribute \$36,500 for the easement conveyance. (C-04-0140)
- C. Conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Stuart L. and Kelli R. Kerns for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 19.83 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The City and County will jointly contribute \$38,610 for the easement conveyance. (C-04-0141)
- D. Conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Darrel L. and Patricia A. Schrader, and Lonnie L. and Brenna S. Schrader for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 63.53 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The City and County will jointly contribute \$60,690 for the easement conveyance. (C-04-0142)
- E. Conservation easement agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Darrel L. and Patricia A. Schrader for property generally located along Salt Creek from Wilderness Park to one-half mile south of Martell Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska, consisting of 41.25 acres. The property is located within the 100-year floodplain as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The City and County will jointly contribute \$39,600 for the easement conveyance. (C-04-0143)

- G. An agreement and accompanying resolution with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for the design and construction of 6.25 miles of Project STPB-55(150), Jamaica North Trail, beginning at 6th and Calvert Streets and nding one-half mile south of Saltillo Road. The County previously obtained a grant through the Surface Transportation Enhancement Program for funding of the project. The County will contribute \$100,000 of the total cost of the project. (C-04-0097 and R-04-0020)
- H. A utility relocation agreement between the County and Lancaster County Rural Water District Number 1 relating to Project 04-02 for Erosion Control at Box Culverts and Bridges, County Structure R-168. The total amount of the project is estimated at \$7,450, of which \$7,450 is estimated to be the share of the cost chargeable to the County. (C-04-0113)
- An agreement between Midland Recycling, Lancaster County, the City of Lincoln and the Public Building Commission for the collection and recycling of office paper, magazines, newspapers, cardboard and books from City and County facilities. The term of the agreement is January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2007 and each entity can terminate upon 60 days written notice. The estimated cost of this service is \$1,020, however, Midland Recycling does not charge for the recycling services and the total annual revenue for recyclables for all three governmental entities is estimated at over \$5,600. (C-04-0116)
- J. An agreement between Lancaster County, Region V Systems and Cornhusker Place of Lincoln-Lancaster County Inc. for Cornhusker Place to assist the County and Region V by including in the services it presently provides, the detention of individuals who are in Emergency Protective Custody (EPC) in cases in which detention at Cornhusker Place is appropriate. The agreement is effective upon execution and will expire on June 30, 2004. Any party may terminate the agreement by giving 60 days written notice. (C-04-0117)
- K. An agreement with Region V Community Human Services Program (Region V) for Region V, through Cornhusker Place, Inc., to assume the safekeeping, care and sustenance of certain acutely mentally ill individuals in the County. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004. The County will pay Region V the sum of \$110 per individual, per day. (C-04-0137)
- L. An agreement with K & M Land Surveying, Inc. for surveying services on South 98th Street from Old Cheney Road to "A" Street, Project C55-KP-412(1). Term of the agreement is March 22, 2004 to May 7, 2004. The County will pay \$4,400 for the services. (C-04-0118)

The original agreement will be amended to reflect the insertion of Schedule A-5 Health Care Products, including Medicare Part B covered products. PharMerica will bill Medicare Part B directly using its own provider number. (C-04-0115)
- O. An amendment to an agreement with Reynolds Davis, under County Contract C-03-0082, for serving as Project Manager for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program and training throughout the State of Nebraska. The parties had previously entered into an amendment, under County Contract C-03-0493, to extend the term of the agreement and amend the compensation to include additional Fiscal Year 2003 grant funds. The compensation figure was incorrectly calculated in that amendment (C-03-0493), and the parties wish to amend the compensation from \$74,234.25 to \$96,554.26 for the contract term of February 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. - P. An amendment to an agreement with Cedars Youth Services, Inc., under County Contract C-04-0031, for the lease of approximately 1,090 square feet in the Northbridge Building.
