6) OLD BUSINESS:

A. An agreement with Family Services d/b/a CF Star for wraparound services to youth who are wards of the State of Nebraska Health and Human Services Southeastern Service area and who reside in Lancaster County. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. The County will pay up to \$380,226.07 for the services. (C-04-0274)

6) OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

- B. An agreement with Family Services d/b/a CF Star for administrative oversight of the evaluation and quality assurance components required within the system of care. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. The County will pay \$172,951.50 for the services. (C-04-0275)
- C. An agreement with Family Services d/b/a CF Star for care coordination services using the wraparound process for youth, ages 10-18 years old, who have severe emotional disorders and are at risk of becoming involved in the juvenile justice system. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. The County will pay \$55,086.50 for the services. (C-04-0276)

7) **NEW BUSINESS**:

- A. An interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln to provide the City with an appropriate facility (Youth Assessment Center) for the temporary detention of juveniles taken into custody by the Lincoln Police Department pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-248. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005. The City will pay the County \$50,000 for the services. (C-04-0311)
- B. An interlocal agreement between Lancaster County and the City of Hickman for law enforcement services through the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office. The County will assign one deputy for law enforcement purposes in the City of Hickman. The County will be paid \$4,380.34 per month for the services of the deputy. Term of the agreement is September 1, 2004 to August 31, 2005. (C-04-0312)
- C. An interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln for the widening and reconstruction of Holdrege Street, more particularly described as Holdrege Street from North 84th Street to a point 2,071 feet east of North 84th Street. The City is responsible for maintenance on the new section of Holdrege Street. The County will give the City permission to perform the work. (C-04-0314)
- D. An agreement with BryanLGH Medical Center, for and on behalf of its Independence Center, for non-physician substance abuse treatment services for adolescents placed in the Lancaster County Juvenile Drug Court. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005. The County will pay up to \$30,000 for such services. (C-04-0315)
- E. Addendum Number 4 to County Contract C-04-0247 with General Excavating for the removal and disposal of storm debris from County rights-of-way, providing for a billing rate of \$275 per ton for final removal of debris. (C-04-0313)
