- A. A resolution in the matter of County Final Plat 04060: Hilltop Estates 2nd Addition, requested by Brian D. Carstens and Associates on behalf of owners Kirk K. and Marybeth Helmink, Jonathan Peterson and Brent and Aspen Emery, consisting of three lots on property generally located at South 82nd Street and Pella Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (R-04-0095)
- B. A subdivision agreement with Kirk K. and Marybeth Helmink, Jonathan Peterson and Brent and Aspen Emery, filed by Brian D. Carstens and Associates, for County Final Plat 04060, Hilltop Estates 2nd Addition, on property generally located at South 82nd Street and Pella Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (C-04-0349)
- C. An agreement with the City of Lincoln for medical services at the Youth Services Center to be provided through the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department. The County will pay based upon the following rates: a) a monthly fee of \$6,299.17 for registered nursing services and the availability of physician services, b) \$78.60 per physician's visit to the Detention Center, c) \$8.41 per telephone conversation with the physician, d) physical exam/assessment completed at actual cost, e) \$35 per dose of Hepatitis B vaccine for each employee, f) \$10 for a tuberculosis test of each employee, g) \$20 employment assessment for each employee, and h) \$40 an hour for on-site laboratory services by a laboratory technician. Should the County Attorney's Office require conferences, meetings, or in-court testimony of nurses, it shall be billed to the County at the rate of \$42.50 per hour, and should the County Attorney's Office require the same of physicians, it will be billed to the County at the rate of \$78.60 per hour. (C-04-0350)
- D. Supplemental agreement number 1 to a design contract with Speece & Lewis Engineers, under County Contract C-01-0542, for professional engineering services for Project C55-S-401(6), South 68th Street Viaduct at Hickman, Nebraska. The supplemental agreement provides for the additional work of adding a bikeway to the viaduct and approach roadway on the west side of the project. Cost of such additional work is \$12,800. (C-04-0351)
- E. A grant contract between the Board of Trustees of the Community Health Endowment and Lancaster County, on behalf of the Community Mental Health Center. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2004 through December 31, 2004. The County will receive \$10,000 from the Community Health Endowment fund to assist in remodeling costs of the building located at 2966 "O" Street. (C-04-0353)
- F. An agreement with Hamilton College-Lincoln campus regarding a federal work study program with Lancaster County Corrections. The County will now pay 25 percent of the hourly wage. The agreement includes a 30 day termination clause. (C-04-0355)

- G. An agreement with Mary Hewitt Jones, Attorney at Law, and Norman Langemach, Attorney at Law, for legal representation to indigent parents and juveniles in the Separate Juvenile Court of Lancaster County, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-247(1), (2), (3)(a) and (b), (4), (5), (6) and (8). The County will pay up to \$104,300 for the services. Term of the agreement is August 1, 2004 through December 31, 2005. (C-04-0356)
- H. An agreement with HoriSun Hospice for hospice home care services to residents of Lancaster Manor who are terminally ill with a medical prognosis of six months or less. Term of the agreement is August 1, 2004 through July 31, 2005 and includes a 60 day termination clause. Hospice will pay the County the current Medicare rate for these services. (C-04-0357)
- An amendment to a cooperative agreement with Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services for the Intensive Care Coordination Unit (ICCU). The amendment extends the agreement through September 30, 2004, increases the number of state wards the County will serve, and increases the number of Care Coordinators the County will employ. (C-04-00354)
- J. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Youth Excelling in School Project. The County will receive \$108,953, of which \$47,130 is the County's match share. Term of the grant award is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0358)
- K. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Community Intervention Team (CIT) Project. The County will receive \$67,769, of which \$37,079 is the County's match share. Term of the grant award is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0359)
- L. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Minority Outreach Diversion Project. The County will receive \$40,926, of which \$21,918 is the County's match share. Term of the grant award is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0360)
- M. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Project Services to Enable and Empower Kids (SEEK). The County will receive \$44,004, of which \$18,017 is the County's match share. Term of the grant award is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0361)
- N. Acceptance of a sub-grant award agreement from the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) by the Lincoln/Lancaster County Emergency Management Agency to provide funding for the Fiscal Year 2004 Homeland Security Grant Program - Citizen Corps. The total amount of the grant award is \$120,000. The grant period is December 1, 2003 to November 30, 2005.

 - MilkWorks, Inc., in the amount of \$1,250, for assistance to 75 low income mothers and their babies. (MilkWorks will provide all supplies.)
 - Y.W.C.A., in the amount of \$3,750, for training for 20 female offenders, ages 14 through 18, as part of survival skills training through the "Try Another Way" program.
 - Kiwanis Club of Lincoln, in the amount of \$3,750, for a year round incentive program (Teddy Bear Cottage) for minority pregnant teens/women who seek healthier lifestyle practices.
 - Lincoln Action Program, in the amount of \$4,500, for enhancing the number of telephone lines available for the Communities Helping Immigrants and Refugees Progress (C.H.I.R.P.) language helpline. (The C.H.I.R.P. language helpline is now receiving 1,200 calls per year.)
 - Lincoln Interfaith Council, in the amount of \$7,500, for the "Faces of the Middle East" program to stop gap funding to maintain case management for Middle Eastern clients. (In over three months they have served 720 adults, 15 seniors and 225 youth.)
 - Lincoln Literacy Council, in the amount of \$5,000, to add cultural sensitivity to the training packets, upgrade the "English as a Second Language" (ESL) curriculum, and enhance retention rates for volunteers.
 - **People's City Mission**, in the amount of \$6,500, to assist feeding over 3,000 guests due to 26 percent increase in clients last year.
 - Planned Parenthood of Lincoln, in the amount of \$3,000, to train ten community Latino advocates to work with 240 Latino families on primary prevention health education. (Planned Parenthood of Lincoln works with the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Family and Consumer Science Department.)
 - KZUM Sunrise Communications, in the amount of \$3,500, for a public radio series on children's health and community health in six languages. (KZUM reaches 25,000 listeners.)
