## 5) <u>NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:</u>

- B. An interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration to facilitate the administration of the Drug Treatment Court for the District Court of Lancaster County through the provision of two drug treatment court probation officers, a part-time drug technician and a case manager. Term of the agreement is from September 1, 2004 through February 28, 2005. The County will pay up to \$56,753 for the services. (C-04-0416)
- C. A Harvest Project agreement with the Lincoln Area Agency on Aging (LAAA) for mental health, substance abuse and aging services to elderly residents of Lancaster County. LAAA will provide a specialized care manager to work 40 hours per week to assist in providing these services. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. The County will pay \$52,400 for services. (C-04-0417)
- D. An agreement with Diane Fern to act as a facilitator for the "Try Another Way" grant which was received from the Nebraska Crime Commission for gender specific training for the State of Nebraska. Term of the agreement is from July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. The County will pay up to \$2,350 for the services. (C-04-0418)
- E. An agreement with Amanda Andrae to assist with the research and writing of a grant for the Office of Juvenile Mental Health's Families First and Foremost Family Resource Center. Term of this agreement is August 1, 2004 through August 31, 2004. The County will pay up to \$625 for the services. (C-04-0419)

An amendment to an agreement between the Lancaster County Youth Services Center and the State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services for detention services for youth committed to, or placed with the State's Office of Juvenile Services.
