- C. A cooperative agreement with the United States Department of the Interior, U.S. Geological Survey for joint funding of water resources investigations. - E. An agreement between the State Court Administrator's Office, Clerk of the District Court and Juvenile Court to install the Judicial Users System to Improve Court Efficiency (JUSTICE) system. (C-04-0438)
- F. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Alternatives with Accountability Project. The County will receive \$209,874 in funds and there is a County required match of \$20,987. Term of the grant award is September 1, 2004 to August 31, 2005. (C-04-0440)
- G. An agreement with Anderson, Creager & Wittstruck, P.C. for legal representation to indigent parties in proceedings arising pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-247(1), (2), (3)(a) and (b), (4), (5), (6) and (8) in the Separate Juvenile Court of Lancaster County. Term of the agreement is from January 1, 2005 to December 31, 2007. The County will pay up to \$243,000 for the services. (C-04-441)
- H. An interlocal agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and the Village of Malcolm for sales outlet locations for the Lincoln/Lancaster County keno lottery within Malcolm. The agreement is for a period of five years, effective upon execution. The proceeds will be distributed in the following manner: (1) Six percent of the gross keno proceeds to Malcolm; (2) Two percent of the gross proceeds to pay the state lottery tax; (3) One percent of the gross proceeds to Lincoln for administration costs; (4) 30 percent of the remaining proceeds to Lancaster County; and (5) 70 percent of the remaining proceeds to Lincoln.
