1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, September 28, 2004. (A copy of these minutes is on file in the office of the Lancaster County Clerk or can be accessed at http://www.lancaster.ne.gov).

2) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**:

- A. Presentation of the County-City Volunteer of the Month Award to John Beck for his services with the Lincoln Police Department's Victim/Witness Unit.
- B. Donation of \$15,000 from the Inmate Benefit Fund to the Good News Jail and Prison Ministries of Fairfax, Virginia to help maintain a full-time chaplain for Lancaster County Corrections Rev. Dan Morgan of Good News Jail and Prison Ministries, and Mike Thurber, Lancaster County Corrections Director

- A. A grant contract with Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital for management of the program and funding for the Community Medical Transportation Project in the amount of \$12,500. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005. (C-04-0467)
- B. A grant contract with Lincoln Council on Alcoholism and Drugs, Inc. for funding for the Substance Abuse Prevention Program, in the amount of \$37,000, and the Substance Abuse Evaluation Program, in the amount of \$5,000. The total amount of the grant will be \$42,000. Term of the grant contract is from July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0468)

- C. A grant contract with Friendship Home for funding of the general operation of the Hotel-Motel Project, in the amount of \$3,500. Term of the grant contract is from July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0469)
- D. A grant contract with Lighthouse, Inc. for the management of Project H.I.R.E., a job training and employment placement program for youth ages 16 through 18, in the amount of \$46,827. Term of the contract is September 1, 2004 through August 30, 2005. (C-04-0470)
- E. A grant contract with Berniklau Educational Solutions Team (BEST) for funding for management of a Juvenile Day Reporting Center, in the amount of \$95,000. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0471)
- F. A contract with Metroplex Control Systems, Inc. for replacement of the control system at the Lancaster County Corrections Department. The contract is effective upon execution and ends on December 16, 2005. The County will pay \$941,700 for the services. (C-04-0472)
- G. A contract with Garcia-Chicoine Enterprises, Inc. for guardrail construction on County Project 05-05 in the areas of Northwest 140th Street and West Rock Creek Road, and Northwest 27th Street and West Agnew Road. The County will pay \$34,948 for the services. Work will commence by October 5, 2004 and be completed by November 5, 2004. (C-04-0473)
- H. An addendum to the Cooperative Agreement between the Clerk of the District Court and Nebraska Health and the Department of Health and Human Services/Child Support Enforcement to exercise the renewal option for an additional two-year period. The County previously entered into the Cooperative Agreement under County Contract No. C-03-0608 wherein the County provides assistance in administering Nebraska's State Plan for Child Support Collection and the Establishment of Paternity under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act. The term of the addendum is July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2006. C-04-0477
- Utility Permit Number 727 for the City of Lincoln, through Constructors, Inc. and K2, to construct water and storm lines in County road right-of-way on 40th Street, San Mateo to approximately 500 feet south of Yankee Hill Road, Yankee Hill Road from 40th to 56th Streets, Yankee Hill Road to Union Hill Road. (C-04-0474)
- J. Acceptance of proposal and agreement with the Lincoln League of Women Voters to assist with voter registration sites and provide election night workers in Lancaster County. The County will pay \$4.75 an hour to the League for services provided up to \$2,500. Term of the agreement is September 1, 2004 to August 31, 2005. (C-04-0475)
