The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, January 6, 2004.

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of the minutes of the

Board of Commissioners meeting dated January 6, 2004. Workman,

Heier and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

#### 2) SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

A. The Commissioners Award of Excellence for December, 2003 was presented to Jane Voboril, with the Corrections Department.

## 3) PUBLIC COMMENT:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

4) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, January 13, 2004.

**MOTION:** Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of all claims processed through January 13, 2004. Workman, Heier and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

#### 5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. An interlocal agreement with Seward County for the safekeeping, care and sustenance of juveniles while at the Juvenile Detention Center. Lancaster County will be reimbursed \$213 per youth, per day from Seward County. The agreement is effective upon execution and has a 30 day termination provision. (C-04-0008)

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of an interlocal agreement with Seward County for the safekeeping care and sustenance of juveniles while at the Juvenile Detention Center. Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

B. An agreement with Ameritas Investment Corp. for financial consulting services with respect to financing debt of Lancaster County. Term of the agreement is four years with an option to renew for an additional four year term, beginning upon execution of the agreement by both parties. The County will pay Ameritas in accordance with a fee schedule incorporated in the agreement. (C-04-0009)

**MOTION:** Workman moved and Heier seconded an agreement with Ameritas Investment Corp. for financial consulting services with respect to financing debt of Lancaster County. Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

C. A utility relocation agreement between Lancaster County and Norris Public Power District of Beatrice, Nebraska. The total amount of the project is estimated at \$3,102.30, of which \$1,551.15 is estimated to be the share of the cost chargeable to the County. (C-04-0010)

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of a utility relocation agreement between Lancaster County and Norris Public Power District of Beatrice, Nebraska. Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

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#### 5) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED**:

D. Supplemental agreement number 1 with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for Project STPE-3265(6), South 68<sup>th</sup> Street from Roca Road to Saltillo Road). The County previously entered into a program agreement with the State regarding the project on November 18, 1997. Because the State does not have sufficient qualified personnel available to supervise and inspect the construction, it is necessary to supplement the agreement. The County will perform all staking, inspecting and testing services required under the original agreement, and the State will reimburse the County 80 percent of the cost of these services. All other terms and conditions of the original agreement shall apply. (C-04-0011)

**MOTION:** Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of a supplemental agreement number 1 with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for Project STPE-3265(6), South 68<sup>th</sup> Street from Roca Road to Saltillo Road. Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

E. A grant contract with Lincoln Literacy Council to provide mentoring and language/employment skills for the Refugee Women's Group participants, in the amount of \$22,000. Term of the grant contract is October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004. (C-04-0012)

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of a grant contract with Lincoln Literacy Council to provide mentoring and language/employment skills for the Refugee Women's Group participants, in the amount of \$22,000. Workman, Heier and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

F. A service agreement, in the amount of \$204.48, with Standard Register for annual support service of a signature machine located in the County Assessor/Register of Deeds office. Term of the agreement is January 1, 2004 to December 31, 2004. (NOTE: The agreement was approved by the County Board last year based on the need to have the equipment operating continuously.) (C-04-0007)

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#### 5) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED**:

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of a service agreement, in the amount of \$204.48, with Standard Register for annual support service of a signature machine located in the County Assessor/Register of Deeds office. Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

G. A resolution authorizing installation of curve signs on South 120<sup>th</sup> Street between Saltillo Road and Rokeby Road. One sign will be located 2,000 feet north of Saltillo Road for northbound traffic and one will be located 250 feet south of Rokeby Road for southbound traffic. (R-04-0004)

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of Resolution 04-0004 authorizing installation of curve signs on South 120<sup>th</sup> Street between Saltillo Road and Rokeby Road. Workman, Heier and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

H. Authorization to temporarily close Havelock Avenue between 162<sup>nd</sup> and 176<sup>th</sup> Streets based on a recommendation from the Lancaster County Engineering Department.

**MOTION:** Workman moved and Heier seconded authorization to temporarily close Havelock Avenue between 162<sup>nd</sup> and 176<sup>th</sup> Streets based on a recommendation from the Lancaster County Engineering Department.

Kristy Mundt, Deputy County Attorney, explained that the County Engineering Department recommended Havelock Avenue, between 162<sup>nd</sup> and 176<sup>th</sup> Streets, be temporarily closed due to dangerous conditions to the traveling public. She stated the County Board does have the authority to close the street pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §39-1801. Mundt added that the street would be closed until spring.
