The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

1) <u>MINUTES</u>: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, August 3, 2004.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Heier seconded approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on August 3, 2004. Hudkins, Workman, Heier and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

2) **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

3) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, August 10, 2004.

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of all claims processed through August 10, 2004. Heier, Workman, Hudkins and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

4) **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A. Comprehensive Plan Amendment 04002, requested by the Director of Planning on behalf of the Lincoln Airport Authority, to adopt the "Lincoln Airport Federal Air Regulations (F.A.R.) Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study" as an approved subarea plan of the Lincoln/Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan, and to amend the Land Use Plan accordingly, for the area generally located between Southwest 40th Street and South Coddington Avenue, from West South Street to one-half mile of West "A" Street. (See New Business Item 5A for correlating resolution.)

The Chair opened the public hearing.

The Clerk administered the oath to Duncan Ross, Planning Department.

Ross gave a brief explanation of the comprehensive plan amendment and indicated that the Board would be satisfying the following objectives of the study if approved:

- Approve the Noise Comparability Study as an approved sub-area plan
- Changes in land use in a specific area
- Proceed with a small expansion of the Future Service Limit in the area of Southwest 40th and West "A" Streets

Ross added that the Planning Commission recommended approval of the amendment, as well as the City Council.

The Clerk administered the oath to John Wood, Executive Director of the Lincoln Airport Authority.

Wood encouraged the County Board to adopt the resolution.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. A resolution in the matter of Comprehensive Plan Amendment 04002, by the Director of Planning, on behalf of the Lincoln Airport Authority, to adopt the "Lincoln Airport Federal Air Regulations (F.A.R.) Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study" as an approved subarea plan, as provided in Exhibit "A". (R-04-0099)

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of Resolution 04-0099 in the matter of Comprehensive Plan Amendment 04002, by the Director of Planning, on behalf of the Lincoln Airport Authority, to adopt the "Lincoln Airport Federal Air Regulations (F.A.R.) Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study" as an approved subarea plan, as provided in Exhibit "A". Hudkins, Heier, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

Joseph McDermott, Interim Director of the Nebraska State Fair, appeared.

Hudkins asked McDermott if he and/or other managers have taken the Responsible Hospitality training.

McDermott responded that the Food and Beverage Manager has taken the training and added that the individuals selling alcohol at specific locations will receive the training.

McDermott also requested that the hours of the Latino Festival to be held on Sunday, August 29th be extended to 11 p.m. instead of 10 p.m..

Heier asked McDermott if he had read the Sheriff's recommendations.

McDermott indicated he had seen the letter from the Sheriff and has no problems with any of the recommendations.

MOTION: Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of an application for a Special Designated License from the Nebraska State Board of Agriculture to hold events, beginning on August 27, 2004 through September 2, 2004, in connection with the Nebraska State Fair, subject to the conditions as recommended by the Sheriff and to also approve the request to extend the hours of the Latino Festival to be held on August 29 from 10 p.m. to 11 p.m.. The County will also pay \$100 per weekend where Dr. Paine has agreed to provide on-call services. (C-04-0377)

- E. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for The Hub Project. The County will receive \$17,580. Term of the grant award is July 1, 2004 to September 30, 2004. (C-04-0384)
- **MOTION:** Heier moved and Workman seconded to accept a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for The Hub Project. The County will receive \$17,580.

Hudkins asked if the County has a match share.

Kristy Mundt, Deputy County Attorney, stated there were two grants for The Hub Project (New Business Items 5E and 5F) and indicated there was no County match share for Item 5E, however, Item 5F does have a \$161,000 match on the behalf of the County.

Stevens indicated he had some questions regarding The Hub, however, he would be unable to obtain those answers until he meets with Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator, on Wednesday, August 11th.

The maker of the motion and the seconder withdrew the motion.

By direction of the Chair, New Business Item 5E was held.

F. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for The Hub Project. The County will receive \$226,867, of which \$161,898 is the County's match share. Term of the grant award is September 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005. (C-04-0385)

Hudkins stated the Adams Street Center may be moving to the Community Blood Bank building and asked if the application encompassed the operations of the center and whether the application was specific to that site.

Mundt stated she could check with Health and Human Services. She said she would assume that the application would move with the project and that they could provide notification of the change in address.

Hudkins suggested approval subject to review by the County Attorney's Office.

The maker of the motion indicated he agreed with the approval of the renewal of the application subject to review by the County Attorney's Office.
