The Board of Commissioners meeting was convened at 1:30 p.m..

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, January 25, 2005.

MOTION: Heier moved and Stevens seconded approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting dated January 25, 2005. Schorr, Stevens, Workman, Heier and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

A. The County-City Volunteer of the Month Award was presented to Renee Myers for her services with the Lincoln Police Department.

3) **PUBLIC COMMENT**:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

4) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, February 1, 2005.

MOTION: Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of all claims processed through February 1, 2005. Workman, Stevens, Schorr, Heier and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

5) **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A. An application for Corporate Manager for Benjamin M. Lynch in connection with a Class B (Beer Off Sale Only) and a Class M (Bottle Club) liquor license for Lee Ann, Inc. d/b/a Merle's Food & Drink, located at 8250 West "O" Street, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska.

The Chair opened the public hearing.

The Clerk administered the oath to Benjamin Lynch, applicant.

Lynch stated his parents, Dan and Elizabeth Lynch, have owned Merle's for 26 years and he has been working at the location since he was approximately 12 years old. In 2003 he began learning how to manage the business with the hope to eventually purchase it.

In response to a question asked by Workman, Lynch indicated he would be willing to enroll in the *Responsible Hospitality* course.

The Clerk administered the oath to Elizabeth Lynch.

Mrs. Lynch indicated her son, Benjamin, has taken the class. She further stated that Benjamin deals with employees and customers on a regular basis.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearing was recessed for one week.

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B. Continuation of a public hearing regarding an application for an amusement license from Cara Carney and Brad Bray to hold a country music festival on Saturday, August 13, and Sunday, August 14, 2005 at 15305 Van Dorn Street, Walton, Lancaster County, Nebraska. Hours for the festival will be 10 a.m. to 1 a.m. on Saturday and 12 p.m. (Noon) to 8 p.m. on Sunday. (See Old Business Item 6A for correlating application for Special Designated License.)

The Chair reconvened the public hearing.

Cara Carney, co-applicant, submitted the following documentation into the record:

- Letter agreeing to conditions as recommended by Sheriff, County Engineer and Health; a certificate of insurance and signatures of approximately 44 neighbors who have been notified of the event and are in support (Exhibit 1)

In response to a question asked by Hudkins regarding parking during inclement weather, Carney stated she contacted the Lancaster Events Center, as well as Lincoln Public Schools about using their parking lots. She indicated they have their permission to use the lots and shuttle individuals to and from the festival.

Carney referred to a letter from the Sheriff, dated January 31, 2005, regarding the application for a Special Designated License and indicated there would be no problems in meeting the recommendations as outlined.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.

Workman referred to a recommendation from Building and Safety indicating that the request for amusement license would be in violation of the zoning regulations.

Discussion followed regarding the recommendation from Building and Safety, with Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, indicating that it is scheduled for discussion on the Board's staff meeting agenda for Thursday, February 3rd.

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Board consensus was to defer action regarding an application for an amusement license from Cara Carney and Brad Bray to hold a country music festival on August 13 and August 14, 2005.

C. Continuation of a public hearing regarding County Special Permit 04059, requested by Mark Hunzeker on behalf of David Benes, for the commercial storage and sale of farm chemicals, on property generally located at the northwest corner of North 56th Street (Highway 77) and Mill Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (See Old Business Item 6B for correlating resolution.)

Heier declared a conflict of interest and exited the hearing room at 2:20 p.m..

Hudkins also declared a conflict of interest and exited the hearing room at 2:20 p.m..

Vice Chair, Deb Schorr, reconvened the public hearing.

Workman requested that documentation presented by Garth Glissman be made a part of the record. The documentation included the following (Exhibit 4):

The Clerk administered the oath to David Benes, applicant.

Benes gave an overview of the proposal stating he has been involved in supplying farmers with inputs his entire life. He stated he feels the location is excellent and that he can offer farmers the convenience of a competitive supply close to their farms. Benes stated he will meet all requirements of local and state authorities.

In response to a question asked by Workman, Benes stated he has obtained the required permit from the Department of Agriculture.

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Workman inquired about containers.

Benes stated the chemicals would be containerized.

Schorr inquired about security measures.

Benes stated all buildings would be locked, in addition to a locked gate for the driveway.

Schorr asked Benes if his plans include living on the property.

Benes responded a house is located adjacent to the property and his plans include someone, either an employee, himself, or a member of his family, to live there.

The Clerk administered the oath to Mark Hunzeker, attorney representing applicant.

Hunzeker stated the plan is to have no off-site deliveries and there would be no custom application, no rinsing or other transfer of chemicals on-site and no aerial applications. He stated all chemicals will arrive and leave the site in sealed containers, with the largest container being 275 gallons. Hunzeker added that access to the site will be facilitated by widening the existing drive to allow for semi-truck deliveries to occur without the tractors having to cross the centerline of Mill Road. Ninety percent of the business conducted, he said, will occur within a six week period from April 1st through mid May with approximately one semi-load of chemicals per week and an average of two to three pick ups per day.
