The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

- B. Annual Honorable Mention Commissioners Award of Excellence for 2004 were presented to Melanie Bailey, an employee with the Corrections Department and Sue Pethtel, with Lancaster Manor.

3) PUBLIC COMMENT:

There was no public comment and the meeting proceeded as planned.

4) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, March 15, 2005.

5) **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A. County Change of Zone 04087, from AG Agricultural District to B Business District, requested by Rudolf Strnot, to construct and operate a mini-storage facility on approximately three acres of property generally located on the southeast corner of 134th and "O" Streets (Highway 34) in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (See New Business Item 6A for correlating resolution.)

The Chair opened the public hearing.

The Clerk administered the oath to Rudolf Strnot, 7301 Briarhurst Drive, Lincoln, Nebraska.

Strnot gave a brief overview of the proposal stating that he was requesting the change of zone to build a storage facility on 3.5 acres of property. He added that of the 27 acres, 15 percent of the property is located in the floodplain, however, the property for the storage facility is outside the floodplain. Strnot indicated that the storage facility would be fenced and have a security system, as well as, security cameras for each unit. He added there would also be two full-time employees.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearing was closed.
