The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

1) <u>MINUTES:</u> Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, August 9, 2005.

MOTION: Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting dated August 9, 2005. Schorr, Stevens, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

2) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

A. Report regarding the Region V Prevention Center Program - Sandy Morrissey, Director of Prevention

Sandy Morrissey, Regional Prevention Center Director, and Derek Effie, Regional Prevention Center Prevention Specialist, appeared and gave a brief overview of the program.

Doug Ahlberg, Emergency Management Director, stated the resolution is a requirement of Homeland Security Policy Directive Number 5 which indicates that first responders in the County and the City would have to be NIMS (National Incident Management System) compliant.

Tiedeman, to develop 14 residential acreage units, with associated waiver requests, on property generally located southeast of the intersection of South 25th Street and Roca Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. (See New Business Item 5A for correlating resolution.)
- B. County Preliminary Plat 05002, Whitetail Ridge (f/k/a Tiedeman Acres), requested by Brian D. Carstens and Associates on behalf of Bruce D. Tiedeman and Beverly A. Tiedeman, to develop 14 residential acreage lots, with associated waiver requests, on property generally located southeast of the intersection of South 25th Street and Roca Road in Lancaster County, Nebraska. Carstens gave a brief overview of the proposals, noting that the Village of Roca has given their approval.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify.

No one appeared and the hearings were closed.

Stevens, Workman, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

C. An application for a Special Designated License from BDF L.L.C., located at 317 South 11th Street, to provide liquor beverage service in connection with a dance to be held on Friday, September 2, 2005 from 6 p.m. to 1 a.m. at Country Pines located at 6305 West Adams Street in Lancaster County, Nebraska.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Workman seconded approval of an application for a Special Designated License from BDF L.L.C., located at 317 South 11th Street, to provide liquor beverage service in connection with a dance to be held on Friday, September 2, 2005 from 6 p.m. to 1 a.m. at Country Pines located at 6305 West Adams Street in Lancaster County, Nebraska. Stevens, Schorr, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

D. An application for a Special Designated License from Denton Daily Double, located at 7230 Lancaster Street in Denton, Nebraska, to provide liquor beverage service for a wedding reception on Saturday, September 3, 2005 from 2 p.m. to 1 a.m. at Country Pines located at 6305 West Adams Street in Lancaster County, Nebraska.

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A representative from the Denton Daily Double appeared and indicated there would be two bartenders serving individuals and security staff who will be identifying those of legal age and providing security.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Workman seconded approval of an application for a Special Designated License from Denton Daily Double, located at 7230 Lancaster Street in Denton, Nebraska, to provide liquor beverage service for a wedding reception on Saturday, September 3, 2005 from 2 p.m. to 1 a.m. at Country Pines located at 6305 West Adams Street in Lancaster County, Nebraska. Workman, Schorr, Stevens and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

E. An interlocal agreement between Lancaster County and Platte County to house inmates at the Platte County Detention Facility who are held under Lancaster County's lawful authority. Lancaster County will pay Platte County the sum of \$45 per inmate for each day the inmate is housed by Platte County. The agreement is effective upon execution by both parties and will be for a one year period. This agreement replaces and rescinds the agreement executed by the County Board on August 2, 2005 under County Contract C-05-0408. (C-05-0426)

Mike Thurber, Corrections Director, indicated the contract was the same as the previous contract approved on August 2nd, with the exception of the rate which decreased from \$55 per inmate per day to \$45 per inmate per day.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of an interlocal agreement between Lancaster County and Platte County to house inmates at the Platte County Detention Facility who are held under Lancaster County's lawful authority. Stevens, Workman, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

F. An amendment to an agreement with the Asian Community and Cultural Center under County Contract C-05-0366 for professional services in the area of care coordination using the wraparound process for youth, ages 10 to 18 years old. The County is requiring the contractor to provide an end of the grant period report and also increasing the percentage of indirect costs. As a result, the parties wish to amend the compensation from \$11,532 to \$12,964. (C-05-0429)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Workman seconded approval of an amendment to an agreement with the Asian Community and Cultural Center under County Contract C-05-0366 for professional services in the area of care coordination using the wraparound process for youth, ages 10 to 18 years old. Schorr, Stevens, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

G. An amendment to an agreement with the Interfaith Council under County Contract C-05-0380 for professional services in the area of care coordination using the wraparound process for youth, ages 10 to 18 years old. The County is requiring the contractor to provide an end of the grant period report and also increasing the percentage of indirect costs. As a result, the parties wish to amend the compensation from \$14,979 to \$16,201. (C-05-0430)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Workman seconded approval of an amendment to an agreement with the Interfaith Council under County Contract C-05-0380 for professional services in the area of care coordination using the wraparound process for youth, ages 10 to 18 years old. Stevens, Schorr, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

H. An amendment to an agreement with Maria J. Pendleton under County Contract C-05-0368, to coordinate the financial aspects of the completion and closing out of the SAMHSA Grant (Families First and Foremost) and prepare the comprehensive finance report as required by SAMHSA. The County is requiring the contractor to provide additional services including the planning of several events in August and September. As a result, the parties wish to amend the compensation from \$12,000 to \$17,000. (C-05-0431)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Workman seconded approval of an amendment to an agreement with Maria J. Pendleton under County Contract C-05-0368, to coordinate the financial aspects of the completion and closing out of the SAMHSA Grant (Families First and Foremost) and prepare the comprehensive finance report as required by SAMHSA. Schorr, Workman and Hudkins voted aye. Stevens voted no. Motion carried.

I. An amendment to an agreement with Renee Dozier under County Contract C-05-0367, to coordinate the completion and closing out of the SAMHSA Grant (Families First and Foremost) and prepare a final comprehensive report as required by SAMHSA. The County is requiring the contractor to provide additional services including the planning of several events in August and September. As a result, the parties wish to amend the compensation from \$18,000 to \$21,250. (C-05-0432)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Workman seconded approval of an amendment to an agreement with Renee Dozier under County Contract C-05-0367, to coordinate the completion and closing out of the SAMHSA Grant (Families First and Foremost) and prepare a final comprehensive report as required by SAMHSA. Workman, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Stevens voted no. Motion carried.

J. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Alternatives with Accountability Project. The County will receive \$71,360 in federal funds and there is a County required match of \$401,811, cash or in kind services, for a total of \$473,171. Term of the grant award is September 1, 2005 to August 31, 2006. (C-05-0427)

MOTION: Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the Alternatives with Accountability Project.

Workman questioned the County's match and asked where the money coming from.

Kristy Mundt, Deputy County Attorney, stated the County has had the program in the past, however the County's match has been less in previous years. She stated the project funds the Juvenile Tracker Program the County has with Cedars for a drug technician. Mundt suggested that the County Board speak with Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator, or Cathy Behrns, Grants Coordinator, if they have further questions.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Schorr seconded to hold the grant award for one week. Workman, Stevens, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

K. Request from CitiCapital Commercial Leasing Corporation, on behalf of KC Concrete Placement Inc., for a refund of 2004 personal property taxes, in the approximate amount of \$1,125.42.

Norm Agena, County Assessor/Register of Deeds, recommended approval of the refund request.
