The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, September 6, 2005.

Heier stated he had indicated during the previous County Board meeting, held on September 6, 2005, that he had a conflict of interest statement from the Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission. He added that it is filed in the County Clerk's Office and is on record.

Hudkins added that the letter discloses that Commissioner Heier does not have a conflict of interest regarding the County's use of ethanol blended fuel because he serves on the Corn Board and also the Board of Commissioners.

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, briefly outlined the reasons for the one step pay increase for Michelle Sewell.
