The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

1) <u>MINUTES:</u> Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, September 20, 2005.

MOTION: Stevens moved and Heier seconded approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting dated September 20, 2005. Schorr, Stevens, Workman, Heier and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

2) SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

A. A resolution in the matter of recognizing agencies and individuals responding to the water main break at the Hall of Justice on September 14, 2005. (R-05-0123)

The Deputy Clerk read Resolution 05-123 into the record.

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of Resolution 05-0123 in the matter of recognizing agencies and individuals responding to the water main break at the Hall of Justice on September 14, 2005. Workman, Schorr, Heier, Stevens and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

3) <u>CLAIMS:</u> Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, September 27, 2005.

MOTION: Workman moved and Schorr seconded approval of all claims processed through September 27, 2005. Heier, Workman, Stevens, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

4) **PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

A. Creation of a Joint Public Agency (JPA). The Joint Public Agency is being created to provide for the design, acquisition of land, and construction of improvements for the Rural to Urban Roadway Transition Streets Program (RUTS) and the design and acquisition of land for the East Beltway. The public agencies initially participating in the Joint Public Agency are Lancaster County and the City of Lincoln. (See New Business Item 5A for correlating resolution.)

The Chair opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to speak in favor of the proposal.

Proponents

The Deputy Clerk administered the oath the Don Thomas, County Engineer.

Thomas stated he supports the joint public agency, the concept of the Rural to Urban Roadway Transition Streets Program (RUTS) and the design and acquisition of right-of-way for the East Beltway. He stated between the City Council and County Board the idea of RUTS has been well received, however, the problem is funding. Thomas stated he feels property tax would not be the correct choice for funding.

The Chair asked if anyone else wished to testify in favor of the proposal.

No one appeared.

Schorr asked what qualifies roadways to be designated for RUTS. She also inquired about the governing body.

Thomas stated they would be determined by traffic counts.

4) **PUBLIC HEARINGS CONTINUED:**

In response to the question about the governing body, Thomas stated it would operate similar to the Railroad Transportation Safety District (RTSD). He stated the governing body would consist of two County Commissioners and two City Council members, with Roger Figard, City Engineer, and himself as co-managers.

The Chair asked if anyone wished to testify in opposition.

Opposition

The Deputy Clerk administered the oath to each of the following individuals who appeared in opposition and who addressed concerns regarding lack of a business plan, no income specified/limited funding, control of the agency, operation of the JPA and better notification to rural residents:

5) **NEW BUSINESS:**

- A. A resolution regarding the creation of a joint public agency as provided by the Joint Public Agency Act with the participation of the County of Lancaster and the City of Lincoln. The Joint Public Agency is being created to provide for the design, acquisition of land and construction of improvements for the Rural to Urban Roadway Transition Streets Program (RUTS) and the design and acquisition of land for the East Beltway. (R-05-0109)
- **MOTION:** Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of Resolution 05-0109 regarding the creation of a joint public agency as provided by the Joint Public Agency Act with the participation of the County of Lancaster and the City of Lincoln.

Heier requested that the issue relating to the East Beltway be a separate motion.

Kristy Mundt, Deputy County Attorney, indicated the purposes could not be separated.

Discussion followed regarding separation of the design and acquisition of land and construction of improvements for the Rural to Urban Roadway Transition Streets Program (RUTS) from the design and acquisition of land for the East Beltway.

ROLL CALL: Schorr and Stevens voted yes. Heier abstained from voting due to a conflict of interest regarding the East Beltway. Workman and Hudkins voted no. Motion failed.

Schorr requested that an item be placed on the staff meeting agenda for Thursday, September 29, 2005 to schedule a work session to be held on a Tuesday morning to discuss other options regarding the Rural to Urban Roadway Transition Streets Program (RUTS).

Heier stated that there should be a clear definition of the Joint Public Agency.

- B. An application for a Special Designated License from Slapshotz Bar & Grill to provide liquor beverage service at an adult softball league tournament on Saturday, October 15, 2005, from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m., at the Star City Optimist Youth Foundation located at 5300 South Folsom, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska.
- **MOTION:** Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of an application for a Special Designated License from Slapshotz Bar & Grill for liquor beverage service on October 15, 2005 at the Star City Optimist Youth Foundation located at 5300 South Folsom, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska. Heier, Workman, Schorr, Stevens and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.

C. A grant contract with Legal Aid of Nebraska for funding for the Domestic Violence Project, in the amount of \$29,050. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006. (C-05-0490)

- D. A grant contract with Heartland Big Brother/Big Sisters for client services, in the amount of \$15,000. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2006. (C-05-0491)
- **MOTION:** Stevens moved and Schorr seconded approval of a grant contract with Heartland Big Brother/Big Sisters for client services, in the amount of \$15,000. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2006. Schorr, Heier, Workman, Stevens and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.
- E. An agreement with the Lancaster County Medical Society (LCMS) to enroll qualified Lancaster County General Assistance clients in national pharmaceutical discount programs and to provide related services, including the training of General Assistance caseworkers. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006. The County will reimburse LCMS based upon the established rates for each discount program and \$2,000 per month for related services. (C-05-0492)
- **MOTION:** Workman moved and Heier seconded approval of an agreement with the Lancaster County Medical Society (LCMS) to enroll qualified Lancaster County General Assistance clients in national pharmaceutical discount programs and to provide related services, including the training of General Assistance caseworkers. Stevens, Workman, Heier, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried.
- F. Utility Permit No. 773 for the City of Lincoln Wastewater System for the installation of a sewer line on South 27th Street and Rokeby Road. (C-05-0493)
