The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m..

Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2006. (C-05-0589)
- MOTION: Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of a grant contract with the Malone Community Center to assist in providing salaries and operating expenses for the Drug Education for Nebraska Students (DEFENS) Program and the Drug Education for Youth (DEFY) Project, an intensive year-long program for at least 25 ethnic minority high-risk youth, ages 9 to 12 years old, in the amount of \$25,000. Workman, Schorr and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried.

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I. An interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln and United Way of Lincoln to jointly provide funding for the oversight and administration of the Community Services Initiative (CSI) Project. The City of Lincoln, United Way of Lincoln and Lancaster County, and the County will each pay \$40,000 of the total contract cost of \$120,000. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2006. (C-05-0590)

MOTION: Workman moved and Stevens seconded approval of an interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln and United Way of Lincoln to jointly provide funding for the oversight and administration of the Community Services Initiative (CSI) Project. Workman, Stevens and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried.

J. An agreement between the State Court Administrator's Office and Lancaster County for reimbursement for 37 computers utilized by County employees in the District Court to access and operate Judicial Users System to Improve Court Efficiency (JUSTICE). The State Court Administrator's Office will reimburse the County at a rate of \$24 per computer, per month. The agreement is effective January 1, 2005. (C-05-0591)

Kristy Mundt, Deputy County Attorney, clarified Neb. Rev. Stat. §12-807 (Reissue 1997) stating that the statute requires the County Board to expend monies from the General Fund for maintenance of abandoned pioneer cemeteries if they are petitioned by 35 adult residents within the County. She also referred to Neb. Rev. Stat. §12-805 which indicates the County Board <u>may</u> expend monies for the maintenance of abandoned pioneer cemeteries and also sets a dollar limit of not exceed \$500. Mundt stated no petition was received which leaves it to the discretion of the County Board whether they want to accept responsibility for maintenance of the two cemeteries.

Russell Shultz, Weed Control Superintendent, appeared and indicated signage would be installed at both cemeteries.

In response to a question asked by Workman regarding the location of the Dietz Cemetery, Shultz responded that it is located approximately one-half mile north of Firth.

Stevens added that the first burial at the Evangelical Cemetery was in 1874 and the last burial was in approximately 1966. The first burial at the Dietz Cemetery was in 1869 with the last burial in approximately 1922.
