During the renewal term, the County will receive 45 percent of the gross revenue or a Guaranteed Annual Minimum Commission (GMAC) of \$135,000. The County will also receive certain products, such as trays, carpet and tile, in an amount equal to \$40,000 as part of the renewal with Evercom. (C-06-0118)
