Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, gave a brief explanation of the circumstances for the request of a one time cash award for Mary Meyer.

4) **NEW BUSINESS**:

The Chief Deputy County Clerk indicated Gary Lacey, County Attorney, requested New Business Item 4Q be moved forward on the agenda.

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Q. Appointment of Alicia Henderson as the Chief Deputy County Attorney for the Juvenile Division, with an annual salary of \$105,335.

Alicia Henderson was introduced to the County Board by Jodi Nelson, judge designate.

MOTION: Workman moved and Heier seconded to approve the appointment of Alicia Henderson as the Chief Deputy County Attorney for the Juvenile Division, with an annual salary of \$105,335.

Stevens stated the Board has not discussed salaries for chief deputies. He indicated he was somewhat concerned that the requested salary exceeds the salary of the previous individual.

Gary Lacey, County Attorney, explained that the requested salary was a percentage of his proposed salary. He apologized for not placing the request on a staff meeting agenda for discussion stating he felt it was appropriate to fill the job as soon as possible to avoid any delays in processing cases. Lacey suggested that the salary be set at the current salary of Jodi Nelson.

Both the maker of the motion and the seconder agreed to amend the original motion and set the salary for Alicia Henderson at \$102,267.

CLARIFICATION OF MOTION: Approval of the appointment of Alicia Henderson as the Chief Deputy County Attorney for the Juvenile Division, with an annual salary of \$102,267.

 - 1. State Farm "Run For Your Life" road race on Saturday, March 25, 2006, beginning at 9 a.m.. The race will begin at the State Farm Regional Office, located at 222 South 84th Street and proceed south on 84th Street to the MoPac Trail to just east of 134th Street.
 - 2. Havelock Run on Saturday, June 17, 2006, beginning at 8 a.m.. (The County portion of the route will be from Havelock Avenue to Adams Street on 84th Street.)

Stevens, Heier, Workman and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried.

Rev. Stat. §43-247(1), (2), (3)(a) and (b), (4), (5), (6) and (8). The County will pay up to \$243,000 for the services. Term of the agreement is from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2008. (C-06-0004)

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of an agreement with Mary Hewitt Jones, Attorney at Law, and Norman Langemach, Attorney at Law, for legal representation to indigent parents and juveniles in the Separate Juvenile Court of Lancaster County pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-247(1), (2), (3)(a) and (b), (4), (5), (6) and (8).

Stevens indicated he would like to see the aggregate limits of liability raised to one million dollars in the future.

Kristy Mundt, Deputy County Attorney, stated the County doesn't have set limits regarding professional liability insurance. She stated they could research setting limits for professional liability insurance if the Board desires.

F. An agreement with the law firm of Thomas & Walton for legal representation to indigent parties in proceedings arising pursuant to Neb. Rev. The County will pay up to \$243,000 for the services. (C-06-0005)

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G. Supplemental Agreement Number 1 revising the agreement between Lancaster County and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads relating to the Jamaica North Trail, Project No. STPB-55(150). The supplemental agreement revises the deadline for beginning construction to April 30, 2006. (C-06-0006)

Heier, Stevens, Workman and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried.

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J. Grant application was submitted electronically January 6, 2006. (C-06-0009)

Gwen Thorpe, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, gave a brief overview of the grant stating that the amount of the grant was approximately \$200,000.

MOTION: Heier moved and Workman seconded approval of the ratification of a Memorandum of Understanding between Lancaster County, Equity-in-Nebraska, the Family Violence Council, Lincoln Medical Education Partnership, Friendship Home, The Hispanic Community Center, Lincoln Police Department, Nebraska Domestic Violence Assault Coalition, and the Rape Spouse Abuse Crisis Center regarding duties and responsibilities for each entity in application for a grant to the Encourage Arrest Policies and Enforcement of Protection Orders Program, signed January 4, 2006. Stevens, Heier, Workman and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried.

K. A Region V Network Provider contract for services under the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) Grant Program. The County, through the services of the Community Mental Health Center, will provide outreach services, community mental health services, screening and diagnostic services. Term of the contract is October 1, 2005 to September 30, 2006. The County will be compensated up to \$32,500 for the services and the County is required to match \$10,833 in cash or in kind. (C-06-0015)
