- 1 APPROVAL OF STAFF MEETING MINUTES OF THURSDAY, JULY 6, 2006
- **MOTION:** Stevens moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the Staff Meeting minutes dated July 6, 2006. Hudkins, Heier, Stevens and Workman voted aye. Schorr was absent from voting. Motion carried.

Schorr arrived at 11:03 a.m.

2 ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

None were stated.

3 BUDGET WORK SESSION - Dave Kroeker, Budget & Fiscal Officer

Don Thomas, County Engineer, gave an overview of the following (Exhibits A & B):

- Bridge Fund, Budget Worksheet Fiscal Year 2007
- Highway Fund, Budget Worksheet Fiscal Year 2007

Thomas said he has budgeted for 2.2 miles of new paving.

Thomas said the cost of a consultant for the East Beltway and sufficient design work to establish corridor protection for the project is estimated at \$500,000 to \$600,000 and said he and Roger Figard, City Engineer, believe the City and County should each invest \$250,000 for "seed money". Federal Aid will come back as a reimbursement against that amount. Thomas suggested that the agreement be structured similar to the original agreement for the beltway study.

Dave Kroeker, Budget & Fiscal Officer, noted that the Board has \$1 million budgeted in the Keno Fund for roads and said that could be used to fund the County's portion.

Thomas said he did not include paving of Yankee Hill Road between Street 40th Street and South 56th Street in the budget (estimated cost is \$270,000). He said Figard would like to see it done as a Rural to Urban Transportation System Program (RUTS) road and said suggested that the County enter into an interlocal agreement with the City, providing funding in the amount of \$270,000 to City and allowing the City Engineer to do the work.

Thomas expressed concern that the project to pave Arbor Road east of North 70th Street to provide access to a proposed motocross track at the Abbott Sports Complex is "development driven" and that priorities are being set within his budget that are not part of the normal road program.

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, said the project may be delayed, due to concerns on the part of the Abbott Foundation.

There was general consensus to indicate a willingness to pave the road if a "world class" motocross track is constructed and to continue to designate funds in the Keno Fund for the project.

Eagan said he will make sure that Doug Pillard, County Engineering, receives notice of Transportation Committee meetings.

Schorr asked, "If you had another half million, what would you do with it?"

Thomas said paving would be the easiest. He said another option would be to invest more than \$250,000 in the East Beltway.

Hudkins noted that the Board has "targeted" 4 miles of new paving and asked Thomas to bring back a recommendation on projects.
